



Even When We Fail

I had a wonderful childhood. I remember how carefree it was. I didn't worry about anything. I hardly worried about the shoes on my feet. I was running free, playing, and doing whatever I wanted. Mama took care of everything, and the only thing I worried about was doing what she told me.

Of course, when I didn't do what she told me, I had a whole new worry—the switch! (For those of you who didn't grow up in the South, that's a small green tree branch that was used to strike the back of the legs, and it stings!)

Mama knew we children needed discipline, but she never stopped loving us. Really, the discipline was proof of her love—she loved us enough to give us what we needed, even when it hurt.

When I grew up Mama wasn't there to watch over me anymore, and it seemed I had troubles wherever I went. Facing the world on my own was overwhelming at times. And that's when I remembered I had someone better than Mama to watch over me and take care of everything. I had the Lord.

I'm thankful we have a Father who takes care of it all. Jesus said, "Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ... For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things" (Matthew 6:31-32). If He takes care of the lilies and the sparrows, then He'll take good care of us.



All we need is to walk in that simple childlike faith and follow the path that Jesus laid out for us. The Lord came down to a world full of troubles, problems, and heartaches. People are frustrated and don't know what to do. Most of them don't realize all they have to do is listen to Jesus and follow Him, and He sets our minds at rest.

Jesus said, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

The Lord is the Master of everything, and He didn't save us to leave us desolate. He has plans to lead us to beautiful places, ones we haven't seen or experienced before. All the problems of life can disappear when we enjoy the glory and grandeur of what the Lord reveals to us along the way.

All the apostles and many of the first century Christians suffered greatly. But the suffering never outweighed the blessing and reward.

Jesus promised to be our friend, Savior, and Lord. What He accomplished for us holds fast. Even though the logic is totally contrary in the reasoning of worldly men, somehow God has made us able to stand in the midst of suffering.

Being a child of God also means the Father won't let us get away with disobedience. Just like my Mama loved us kids enough to discipline us, God also does what it takes to keep us on the straight and narrow path.

When Christ came to the earth to suffer and die, He didn't do it so we could satisfy our carnal desires. He didn't heal the crippled so they could walk down to the cat houses or the hell holes. He didn't open the eyes of the blind so they could look at dirty pictures. He didn't open the ears of the deaf so they could listen to the lies of the devil and follow the teachings of the world.



Jesus came to open the eyes of our souls and to fill us with His spirit. He came to pour out His love and goodness that we might know the fellowship of Almighty God. Sometimes we reach for God like a spare tire. When life gives you a flat, you reach for the spare in order to keep going your own way. But God doesn't want to be your spare tire. DEEP STATE

BEHIND THE DEEP STATE

There is a powerful constellation of shadowy and even secret organizations working to overthrow liberty and sovereignty worldwide, but they and their agenda are increasingly being exposed and opposed by people everywhere.

he Deep State may be a relatively new term. popularized by Donald Trump and his Make America Great Again movement in recent years, but shadowy forces behind the scenes have been working together for evil purposes for a very long time. They have names and addresses, too. And while they may be legion and extremely powerful, "they" can be stopped. But first, they must be identified and exposed.

he surface-level Deep State is now blatantly obvious. In fact, in mid-2018, a "senior" administration official took to the New York Times to boast of internal federal efforts to sabotage President Trump. On a panel discussion at the Hayden Center the next year, former Acting CIA chief John McLaughlin was asked by the moderator about the "Deep State" trying



to "take [Trump] out." The former spook boss responded: "Thank God for the Deep State."

In short, there is a Deep State swamp inhabiting Washington, D.C., with tentacles that extend worldwide. The term was once applied to the Soviet Union and Third World nations. But today, it is obvious such a cabal exists in the United States.

In fact, three in four Americans surveyed in 2018 by Monmouth University Polling Institute said they believe there is "a group of unelected government and military officials" who "secretly manipulate or direct national policy." They are right, of course.

Pormer congressional staffer Mike Lofgren, who holds a top-secret security clearance and was one of the first to apply the term "Deep State" to the United States, describes it as "a hybrid entity of public and private institutions ruling the country," suggesting Wall Street and Big Tech were critical components of it. He is partly correct in his assessments. But it goes much deeper than he seems to realize.

Far more important than the "Deep State" within the federal bureaucracy, Wall Street, and the "intelligence" community is the cabal pulling the strings of that Deep State - what this writer has been referring to for years as the "Deep State behind the Deep State." It consists of a broad network of powerful individuals and organizations—some known, others largely unknown, some above ground with websites and public membership rosters, others operating in total secrecy.

The network transcends party lines. It includes "conservatives" and "liberals," selfstyled Protestants and Catholics, and more. It has dominated U.S. politics and especially foreign policy for generations, at least until Trump got elected.



Of course, the Deep State behind the Deep State has a lot of overlap in terms of membership and leadership with the above-ground forces. Countless groups such as the World Affairs Council, the Aspen Institute, Le Cercle, the Brookings Institution, the Club of Rome, the Atlantic Council, the World Economic Forum, and even the relatively new "World Government Summit" play a major part in the machine.

The network transcends party lines. It includes "conservatives" and "liberals," self-styled Protestants and Catholics, and more. It has dominated U.S. politics and especially foreign policy for generations, at least until Trump got elected. Members range from politicians and businessmen to "religious" leaders and academics. Their network is vast and diabolical. And it threatens everything Americans hold dear. In short, the often-celebrated goal of a "New World Order" emerging from the "Great Reset" would mean the end of liberty and perhaps even our very humanity.

While there are numerous other organizations that could have been included if not for space constraints, what follows is a list of the most critical groups pulling the strings. Taken together, these groups and their leaders represent the heart of the so-called "invisible government behind the scenes" seeking to dominate not just the United States but all of humanity.

Late Georgetown University History Professor Carroll Quigley, celebrated as a mentor by President Bill Clinton, bragged that he spent decades close to the core of what is today known as the Deep State. In his 1966 book Tragedy and Hope: A History of the World in Our Time, Quigley outlined many of the goals of the "Anglo-American establishment," as he called it, including a one-world government and economic regime controlled by them. He also admitted that he has "no aversion" to its globalist agenda.

"The powers of financial capitalism had another farreaching aim, nothing less than to create a world system of financial control in private hands able to dominate the political system of each country and the economy of the world as a whole," he explained, adding that this network acts like and works with communists. "This system was to be controlled in a feudalist fashion by the central banks of the world acting in concert, by secret agreements arrived at in frequent private meetings and conferences."

Some of these "secret meetings and conferences" that would control the global neo-feudalist system are outlined here.

Council on Foreign Relations

The Council on Foreign Relations is the "American branch" of the global Round Table Groups network originating in England that "believes national boundaries should be obliterated and one-world rule established," Quigley revealed in his book. It is essentially the U.S.-based sister organization of the U.K.-based Royal Institute of International Affairs (RIIA). also known as Chatham House, which is working on the same agenda on the other side of the Atlantic.

The Round Table Groups that Quigley described in his book were launched with funding from mining magnate Cecil Rhodes, a protégée of the unfathomably wealthy Rothschild banking dynasty. The CFR is basically the above-ground tentacle of this operation in the United States, Quigley suggests. The goal: bring the entire world into subjection of more "enlightened" elitists using political and economic means.

Founded in 1921 by a cabal of mega-bankers and globalists, the goal of the CFR was to get the United States to join



some sort of proto-global government. They realized more prodding was needed after the U.S. Senate voted decisively against joining the League of Nations. Thanks in large part to the efforts of its members and the control they wield over policy and public opinion, the U.S. government actually helped lead the way in creating the United Nations less than 30 years later.

For generations, it has been seeking a global government openly, without scrutiny from the press. The agenda can be seen clearly in its own publication, the magazine Foreign Affairs, which is where Deep State bigwigs from World Economic

Forum boss Klaus Schwab to Microsoft founder and vaccine fanatic Bill Gates announce their intentions to elitists before making the agenda more public.

In the April 1974 issue, then-Assistant Secretary of State Richard Gardner outlined how Deep Staters would pursue the globalist agenda. "In short, the 'house of world order' will have to be built from the bottom up rather than from the top down," he wrote. "An end run around national sovereignty, eroding it piece by piece, will accomplish much more than the old-fashioned frontal assault." In other words, the process of subverting nationstates for globalism must be slow and deceptive.

The late U.S. Admiral Chester Ward, who spent 16 years as a member before defecting and blowing the whistle, said reading Foreign Affairs would reveal the policies of the U.S. government a few years in advance. And he confirmed that the end goal of the CFR is, in fact, a oneworld government. "The main purpose of the Council on Foreign Relations is promoting the disarmament of U.S. sovereignty and national independence, and submergence into an all-powerful one-world government," he warned in his book Kissinger on the Couch.

"This lust to surrender the sovereignty and independence of the United States is pervasive throughout most of the membership," Ward continued. "In the entire CFR lexicon, there is no term of revulsion carrying a meaning so deep as America First." It is no wonder that the CFR and its members hated Trump





with such deranged and violent fury: that was the core of his campaign!

This Deep State front, with about 5,000 members, is the most powerful "think tank" in America by far. To get a sense of just how powerful it is, comments made by then-Secretary of State Hillary Clinton in a 2009 speech at the CFR's new office in Washington are very revealing. "I am delighted to be here in these new headquarters," said Clinton, whose husband and daughter are both members. "I have been often to, I guess, the mother ship in New York City, but it's good to have an outpost of the Council right here down the street from the State Department. We get a lot of advice from the Council, so this will mean I won't have as far to go to be told what we should be doing and how we should think about the future."

By Clinton's own admission, it was not President Obama, Congress, or the American people telling her what to do — it was the

unelected cabal at the CFR! If Trump had credited some organization with telling him what to do and how to think about the future, it would be front-page news. But because much of the media is involved in the CFR, both as corporate members and as individual members, there was total silence.

Similar sentiments were expressed by Vice President Joe Biden during a discussion at the CFR. As then-CFR President Richard Haass was introducing himself, Biden revealed where he was getting his orders from. "Hi, I'm Richard, and I work here at the Council on Foreign Relations," CFR boss Haass said by way of introduction. Biden responded, "And I work for Richard," before laughing awkwardly. Despite the forced laugh, Biden was revealing something very important: CFR gives instructions, and political puppets obey.

Lest this seem to be an attack on Democrats, top Republicans are deeply involved with the CFR, too. George W. Bush's Vice



President Dick Cheney, for example, was filmed on video bragging about it. "I've been a member [of the CFR] for a long time and was actually a director for some period of time,"declared Cheney, father of anti-Trump RINO Liz Cheney. "I never mentioned that when I was campaigning for re-election back home in Wyoming." Like Biden, Cheney cackled, too.

The CFR's membership list, which is posted online, reads like a who's who of the Deep State: top leaders of both parties, countless current and former members of Congress, leading bureaucrats, "journalists," columnists, editors, anchors,

commentators, media execs, CEOs, cabinet secretaries, Supreme Court justices, former presidents and vice presidents; Federal Reserve bosses, celebrities, church pastors, military brass. ambassadors, international organization bigwigs, foundation chiefs, professors, and more.

Corporate members include the world's largest bailedout mega-banks (BlackRock CEO Larry Fink is on the board), Big Oil, Big Pharma firms such as Pfizer, the military-industrial complex, publishers, and much of the establishment media. Virtually every big bank and major pharmaceutical company you can name is

a member, along with the companies that own virtually every major media outlet.

While some CFR rank-andfile members may plead ignorance and likely serve as "useful idiots," there is a core that dominates, according to Admiral Ward. This "much smaller group but more powerful," Admiral Ward said, is "made up of Wall Street international bankers and their key agents" and is "headed by the Rockefeller brothers." Ultimately, the inner circle of the CFR is seeking what Ward described as "the world banking monopoly from whatever power ends up in control of the global government."

TRILATERAL COMMISION

Rockefellers operate far beyond just the CFR. In fact, David Rockefeller, the banking magnate and family figurehead who served as CFR chairman for 15 years and "honorary chairman" until his death in 2017, founded another Deep State organization even more elitist than the CFR. Known as the Trilateral Commission, it affects policy across North America, Europe, and East Asia. The goal, put simply, is ending self-government to be replaced by global technocratic control as part of what the group refers to as the "New International Economic Order."

Members include BlackRock boss Larry Fink, billionaire Michael Bloomberg, Henry "New World Order" Kissinger, NBC "journalist" Andrea Mitchell, disgraced Gen. David Petraeus, Rockefeller Foundation boss Rajiv Shah, New York Times columnist Bret Stephens, and others. When they go into "public service," some temporarily



step down. Recent examples include U.S. Secretary of State Anthony Blinken, U.S. Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman, U.S. National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan, Federal Reserve Board of Governors Lael Brainard, U.S. Ambassador to China Nicholas Burns, and more.

Rockefeller, the founder

of the group, has been remarkably transparent about his real agenda. In his 2002 autobiography *Memoirs*, the Deep State kingpin bragged of "conspiring" with a "secret cabal" of "internationalists" "against the best interests of the United States" to form a "global political and economic structure - one world, if you will."

In founding the Trilateral Commission, the Communist China-loving Rockefeller partnered with Columbia University Professor Zbigniew Brzezinski, who then went on to become National Security Advisor for President Jimmy Carter. What attracted Rockefeller to Brzezinski, whose children followed in his footsteps, was a book Brzezinski wrote in 1970 titled Between Two Ages: America's Role in the Technetronic Era.

Brzezinski claimed in the book that America was basically "obsolete" and that a new world order based on technocratic governance was needed. While acknowledging some problems in the Soviet system, Brzezinski gushed about Marxism generally. "Marxism represents a vital and creative stage in the maturing of man's universal vision," he wrote. "Marxism is simultaneously a victory of the external, active man over the inner, passive man and a victory of reason over belief: it stresses man's capacity to shape his material destiny." Throughout the book, Brzezinski outlined his vision

of a new global order bringing the nations of Western Europe, North America, and Japan together to facilitate eventual convergence with the Communist world into a global system. Rockefeller gathered dozens of key political, corporate, and academic leaders from each of those to create the Trilateral Commission as a machine to advance that vision.

In 1979, liberty-minded U.S. Senator Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) explained what was going on in his memoir, With No Apologies. "In my view, the Trilateral Commission represents a skillful, coordinated effort to seize control and consolidate the four centers of power — political, monetary, intellectual, and ecclesiastical," he wrote. "What the Trilaterals truly intend is the creation of a worldwide economic power superior to the political governments of the nationstates involved... As managers and creators of the system, they will rule the future."

Another major criticism of the Trilateral Commission came from Stanford historian Antony Sutton and researcher Patrick Wood. Dubbed Trilaterals Over Washington, the book was the first indepth and critical look at this shadowy organization. The Commission, the book explained, was aiming to create a "New International Economic Order" to replace free markets with scientific management of the economy—supposedly in the name of efficiency and sustainability.

nother key element of Brzezinski's vision: subverting nation-states in favor of European Unionstyle regional governments, a rallying cry adopted by the Rockefeller cabal that now infects every corner of the world. "We cannot leap into world government in one quick step," explained Brzezinski at the 1995 "State of the World Forum" convened by former Soviet dictator Mikhail Gorbachev and the Rockefellers. "The precondition for eventual globalization - genuine globalization — is progressive regionalization."

BILDERBERG GROUP


nother one of the shadowy but not-quite secret organizations that make up the Deep State behind the Deep State is Bilderberg. Founded in 1954 by former Nazi SS member Prince Bernhard, with a major assist from the Rockefeller clan, the organization has for decades been derided as a sort of "shadow" global government. Even its members and apologists acknowledge its outsized influence on global affairs.

Meeting annually in Europe or the United States, the official narrative claims the group was established as a mere forum for "informal discussions" to "foster dialogue." They claim there are no desired outcomes, no minutes, no reports, and no policy statements. But multiple attendees and members have revealed that much more is taking place as between 120 and 150 attendees — most of them top leaders of government, media, business, military, intelligence, and academia — meet behind closed doors and heavily armed guards.

In fact, some attendees have publicly admitted that policies are discussed and even set at these meetings. For instance, former NATO boss and two-time Bilderberg attendee Willy Claes stated in a radio interview that reports of speeches given at the summit are compiled and used in setting policy. Etienne Davignon, then-Bilderberg chairman,

admitted in an interview with EU Observer that the group played a significant role in creating the euro currency and the European Union. Countless similar admissions have been made over the years.

This writer covered the Bilderberg Summit in Copenhagen, Denmark, in 2014 and ran into several attendees outside the hotel. One of them, Dutch Labor Party chief Diederik Samsom, admitted he was attending the summit in his official capacity as a

parliamentary leader, saying that as an elected official, there was no way to exit his public role. If true, it means Americans in attendance could be in violation of the Logan Act, barring U.S. citizens from negotiating policy with foreigners without explicit approval.

Some attendees have admitted the agenda. Former British Chancellor of the Exchequer and Bilderberg regular Denis Healey told the left-wing U.K. Guardian it was a little "exaggerated, but not wholly unfair" to say that the outfit's overall goal was a world government.



"Those of us in Bilderberg felt we couldn't go on forever fighting one another for nothing and killing people and rendering millions homeless," he claimed in 2001. "We felt that a single community throughout the world would be a good thing." In other words, the secretive effort to build a world government without public consent is for your own good!

Equally alarming is the apparent role played by Bilderberg in selecting and vetting would-be world leaders. Consider that both Bill Clinton and Barack Obama went to Bilderberg meetings as little-known and unremarkable politicians before going on to become presidents of the United States. Numerous cabinet members also attended before being appointed.

The situation is similar for Europe, with Tony Blair of Britain and Italy's Mario Monti (also a Trilateral member) selected to lead their respective governments shortly after attending
Bilderberg. At the European
Union level, where leaders
are unelected technocrats
with no accountability, the
situation is similar. "All
the recent presidents of
the European Commission
attended Bilderberg meetings
before they were appointed,"
state-funded British
broadcaster BBC reported.

This year, the Bilderbergers met in Lisbon, Portugal, in mid-May, with virtually no reporting by the establishment media. In the group's press release, the topics of discussion listed included Artificial Intelligence, NATO, China, banking, Europe, energy transition, Russia, Ukraine, India, and more. Analysts warned that AI would be critical to Bilderberg's agenda and that many of its attendees are key players in emerging technology.

Among the Americans at this year's event whose work or expertise intersects with AI were Sam Altman, CEO of OpenAI; Alex Karp, CEO of Palantir Technologies Inc.; Satya Nadella, CEO of Microsoft Corporation; Eric E. Schmidt, former CEO, and chair of Google LLC; and Peter Thiel, president, Thiel Capital LLC. Tech overlords from other nations attended, too.

More than a few others in attendance conspiring with foreign globalists were from the Biden administration. These included Director of National Intelligence Avril Haines; Jen Easterly, Director of the U.S. Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency; Tarun Chhabra, Senior Director for Technology and National Security, National Security Council; and Thomas Wright, Senior Director for Strategic Planning, National Security Council.

Skull and Bones & Bohemian Grove



ach of the three groups listed above has a website. But there are other groups in the Deep State behind the Deep State that are so secret members rarely even acknowledge they exist, much less what goes on there. Many of the members of these "above ground" groups are also involved in the secret societies that hide in the shadows. One of the most prominent ones, headquartered at Yale University, is "Skull and Bones," often referred to as the "Brotherhood of Death." Founded in 1832 by notorious opium pusher



William Russell, whose family was in the opium business, the group is widely considered by experts to be among the most secretive and powerful secret societies in the world. Historically, members go on to become U.S. presidents, Supreme Court justices, CEOs of mega-corporations, and congressional leaders. Among them--are multiple members of the Bush dynasty, establishmentbacked "conservative" leader William Buckley, Morgan Stanley founder Harold Stanley, numerous Rockefellers, and many more.

In 2004, the society gained some public notoriety when NBC Meet the Press host Tim Russert asked then-presidential candidates George W. Bush and John Kerry — both members of Skull and Bones — about it. "It's so secret we can't talk about it," Bush responded,

echoing remarks in his biography. Kerry, when asked what it meant that both candidates were members of the order quipped: "Not much, because it's a secret... I wish there were something secret I could manifest; there are all kinds of secrets."

While very little is known about what goes on inside "The Tomb," the group's headquarters, some troubling rituals including, a mock human sacrifice, kissing skulls, and even sex acts, have been observed. In 2001, ABC News aired video footage from the group's courtyard captured by the New York Observer that featured "Bonesmen" engaged in these bizarre spectacles.

The most important revelations about the group came from Stanford historian Sutton, who also exposed the Trilaterals. After receiving documents from Charlotte Iserbyt, a Reagan administration education official whose father and grandfather were Bonesmen, Sutton wrote the book America's Secret Establishment: An Introduction to the Order of Skull and Bones, describing it as basically a recruiting ground for a secret plot to create a world government.

Perhaps more importantly, Sutton explained the group's strategy. "In this [dialectical] process, change requires conflict, and conflict requires the clash of opposites," he explains. "You can't just have a 'right,' you must have a 'right' and a 'left." This very tactic was exemplified in the 2004 election between two fellow Bonesmen, a supposed "conservative Republican" and a supposed "liberal Democrat."

Another extremely influential secret society brings thousands of the world's most powerful men together annually in the redwood forests of Northern California. Known as the Bohemian Grove, the confab has featured every Republican president of the last century except Trump and many Democrat presidents, too. It also brings in CEOs, cabinet secretaries, foreign leaders, and more for bizarre rituals and private discussions.

Delegates to the 1945 conference that created the United Nations went down, as well. The attendee list for 2019 was leaked to this writer by an attendee and included an incredible array of contemporary powerbrokers at every level. Just this summer, House Speaker Kevin McCarthy was spotted there, according to media reports.

While in private, he blasted the organization using language that cannot be repeated, President Richard Nixon revealed that the group was key on his road to the White House. "If I were to choose the speech that gave me the most pleasure and satisfaction in my political career, it would

be my Lakeside Speech at the Bohemian Grove in July 1967," he explained in his autobiography. "Because this speech traditionally was off the record, it received no publicity at the time. But in many important ways, it marked the first milestone on my road to the presidency. It was an emotional assignment for me and also an unparalleled opportunity to reach some of the most important and influential men."

ne of the many occult rituals that takes place is known as the Cremation of Care, a bizarre spectacle that involves burning what members claim is an "effigy" of a child at the foot of a 40-foot-tall owl statue while chanting to "forest spirits." Talk show host Alex Jones was able to sneak in and videotape the ceremony featuring hooded men carrying torches amid horrifying screams. "Owl of Bohemia, we beseech thee, grant us thy counsel," the leader declares.

After taking that video, Jones confronted political bigwig and Bohemian David Gergen on the streets of D.C., where he admitted to being a "happy" member. "Have you been there for the ceremony, the Cremation of Care?" Jones asked. Gergen, with his facial expression quickly changing, responded: "Frankly, I do not think that is something I need to talk to you about."

f course, these evil groups of powerful men conspiring against liberty, humanity, and God are hardly a new phenomenon. In fact, some 3,000 years ago, King David wrote in Psalm 2 that the "kings of the Earth" and the "rulers" "conspire against the LORD and His Anointed." WHAT IS THE

AI CHAT BOT REPLIKA

AND WHY IS IT A PROBLEM FOR MANY?




EXAMINING THE CDC'S COVID RESPONSE ACTIONS "COERCION. DECEPTION. CENSORSHIP."

In June of 2022, the NIH published a study bemoaning Americans' depleted trust in public health: "Public trust in federal government agencies has never been as important as it has been during the Covid-19 pandemic, yet public suspicions of scientific experts and levels of distrust of government institutions are increasing for a variety of reasons[.]" But the authors failed to identify the real reason for this loss in trust: executive agencies did not "follow the science" during the pandemic, but instead adopted policies and engaged in covert action apparently designed to silence dissent, benefit pharmaceutical companies, and protect the reputations of allies. They have lost the public's trust because they are not worthy of it.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC's) denial of natural immunity provides a perfect example of this abuse of authority. Even before Covid-19 vaccines became available, so-called experts cast doubt on the efficacy of natural immunity in preventing reinfection from Covid-19.2 This was a rather curious position since the immune system's ability to protect against viral reinfection has been recognized since the Athenian plague of 430 B.C. as epidemiologist (formerly of Harvard) Martin Kulldorff has noted.3



Once the vaccines became accessible to the general public, the public health establishment trumpeted this woefully unscientific claim even more forcefully, not least of all CDC, which issued guidance in July of 2021 declaring that everyone should get vaccinated, even those who had recovered from Covid-19. The study upon which the agency relied to substantiate this position was based on data gathered in Kentucky and purported to establish that everyone should get vaccinated, including the naturally immune.

Analysts identified several weaknesses in the study. The results only showed that those who had natural immunity and received a Covid-19 shot had slightly fewer positive test results than those who only had natural immunity. This did not translate into a clinical (real-world) benefit in terms of reducing symptomatic disease, hospitalization, death, or transmission. Indeed, an Israeli study of about 6.4 million individuals from August of 2021 "demonstrated that natural immunity confers longer lasting and stronger protection against infection, symptomatic disease, and hospitalization caused by the Delta variant ... compared to the [Pfizer BioNTech] two-dose vaccine-induced immunity. This is consistent with scientific knowledge of immunology broadly—vaccines are based on the same immunological mechanism as natural immunity (stimulating the immune system to generate an antibody response).

While the CDC claimed that the Covid-recovered should get vaccinated because the duration of immunity following infection remained unknown, the same was true of the vaccines. As Dr. Kulldorff and Dr. Jayanta Bhattacharya of Stanford University explained, "While it is true that we do not know how long natural immunity after recovery lasts ... the immunological evidence to date suggests that protection against disease will last for years." In any event, "We do not know how long [vaccine mediated immunity] will last either, and there is no reason to believe it provides longer lasting or more complete immunity than recovery from Covid."8



Another fatal flaw in the study was that the CDC had conducted this research in all fifty states but only published the results from Kentucky. Likewise, it had zeroed in on two months of data—for no apparent reason—although it had collected data over 19 months, suggesting that it had cherry-picked data in order to reach a foregone conclusion.9 This isn't science, but propaganda.

When the CDC finally, many months later and under pressure, released data from California and New York showing natural immunity's comparative strength to that achieved through vaccination, the agency nevertheless baselessly concluded that "vaccination remains the safest strategy." 10

The New Civil Liberties Alliance (NCLA), where I am an attorney, represented numerous clients who had demonstrable natural immunity established through serological testing but were being threatened with termination from their jobs for refusing to get a Covid-19 inoculation. In a couple of cases, the mandate was imposed by state government employers, for example, Michigan State University, or state executive officials such as the governor of Rhode Island. For the most part, courts were reluctant to wade into the territory of assessing scientific arguments. When state employers trotted out experts proclaiming that the evidence supporting the efficacy of natural immunity was up in the air in order to rebut the testimony of NCLA's experts, the courts tended to defer to the state.

In other NCLA cases, the coercion came from on high: various employers, including federal contractors. federal employers, and private businesses with 50 or more employees, were forced to require vaccination by the Biden Administration's orders, most of which federal courts eventually deemed unlawful based on the President's lack of authority to promulgate vaccine mandates through executive decree.



Incidentally, all of these ■ mandates were based on vet another governmentfacilitated deception: that the vaccine stopped or significantly reduced transmission and conferred a public health benefit beyond that enjoyed by the unvaccinated individual. But there was never any evidence to substantiate this supposition. At a December 10, 2020, Food and Drug Administration (FDA) meeting, FDA advisor Dr. Patrick Moore stated, "Pfizer has presented no evidence in its data today that the vaccine has any effect on virus carriage or shedding, which is the fundamental basis for herd immunity." Around the same time, the FDA Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) press

release acknowledged that there was no "evidence that the vaccine prevents transmission of SARS-COV-2 from person to person." Yet neither the FDA nor any other government agency did anything to correct the growing public misconception that the vaccine would "stop the spread." 11

Each client had his or her own specific reasons for objecting to the employee mandate in question, but they all recoiled at the idea of subjecting themselves to an unwanted medical intervention, especially one that had not been tested for long-term side effects. While adverse consequences might be rare, they were still possible – including severe

and long-lasting reactions. The plaintiffs protested that they should have the right to make their own cost-benefit assessments, especially when they had stronger immunity than the vaccinated, and even more so as the public learned that the vaccines did not stop transmission of the virus. 12

It wasn't until 2022 that the public health establishment and mainstream media begrudgingly acknowledged the reality: that natural immunity is as, or more, protective against reinfection, and more importantly, transmission, severe illness, and hospitalization than any of the currently available vaccines. 13 That was too late for many NCLA clients, not to

mention thousands of other Americans who had been terminated from their jobs for declining a Covid vaccine.

This all raises the question—why did the government systematically deny a natural, scientific phenomenon that humanity has known about for millennia? Some well-meaning public

health officials likely considered it easier to encourage or pressure everyone to get vaccinated than to make exceptions for the naturally immune. But that cannot be the sole explanation for a widespread campaign to cast aspersions on the scientific fact of natural immunity—and anyone who touted it—that appeared coordinated across various components of the executive branch.

More nefariously, could the political interests of the Biden Administration and pecuniary concerns of pharmaceutical companies have played a role? A key part of Biden's platform, even before his inauguration, was that he would vaccinate America. Blaming vaccine resistors for the pandemic's persistence proved to be a fruitful strategy. Instead of holding politicians accountable for failed promises to contain the virus (unattainable promises, given the nature of contagious respiratory viruses), he redirected public anger towards an easy target: the "selfish" people who refused vaccination because they did not care about their neighbors.14

The censorship took a variety of forms: sometimes, the offending post would be removed; other times, it would be labeled "misleading," and other users prevented from "liking" or "reposting."



At the same time, Scott Gottlieb, Pfizer's director and former commissioner of the FDA, pushed Twitter to censor posts declaring that natural immunity was better than that induced through vaccination. Obviously, recognition of natural immunity's effectiveness was a detriment to

pharma companies' financial interests since a large and ever-growing portion of the population would see no reason to get inoculated with a relatively new vaccine. It would also jeopardize the success of boosters, which held less appeal to those with immunity acquired through infection, but which vaccine manufacturers undoubtedly hoped to profit from far into the future. Gottlieb's effort to suppress such discussions on social media proved successful: posts advocating for recognition of natural immunity's effectiveness were heavily censored on Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, and other social media platforms. And it soon became apparent that this censorship was not a decision made independently by private companies. Nor was it limited to the topic of naturally acquired immunity to Covid-19.



uring the spring and summer of 2021, various government officials openly bragged that they had been directing social media companies to censor so-called misinformation about Covid-19 on subjects including natural immunity, vaccine side effects, and true accounts of such side effects, the lab leak origin theory of the virus, and the efficacy of masks.17 Not only that: President Biden and other members of the Administration publicly stated that they considered social media companies to be responsible for people's deaths from the virus due to "misinformation" propagated on their platforms, and they sought to find ways to hold the companies accountable,18 going so far as to cite specific avenues they were exploring in order to do so.19

Around this time, social media users
noticed intensifying suppression of posts
that challenged government orthodoxy on
Covid-19. The censorship took a variety of
forms: sometimes, the offending post would
be removed; other times, it would be labeled
"misleading," and other users prevented from
"liking" or "reposting." Suspensions—that is,
barring users from using their accounts for
some period of time, including permanently—
became increasingly common. Another tactic
was shadow banning, which means an account's
posts are demoted via the platform's algorithm
so as to appear to other users only infrequently
or not at all.

This growing evidence prompted NCLA to file a lawsuit, Changizi v. HHS, on behalf of three Twitter users, Mark Changizi, Daniel Kotzin, and Michael Senger, who devoted their accounts to criticizing government imposed Covid restrictions on civil liberties on scientific grounds. All experienced a drastic uptick in suspensions from the platform for spreading "misinformation" about Covid-19 when the government began making open threats.

The lawsuit's core allegation was that, by threatening the social media companies to censor in accordance with government demands, the Biden Administration had violated the plaintiffs' First Amendment rights. The plaintiffs cited officials' public admissions that they were directing social media censorship and pointed to the timeline of their suspensions on Twitter, which coincided with the government's escalating threats. 20 In other words, the plaintiffs merely alleged that the government was doing what it said it was doing—communicating privately with social media companies while threatening them publicly in order to accomplish the Administration's censorship aims.


The district court dismissed the lawsuit, declaring that the plaintiffs had not proven their suspensions had occurred at

laptop story and the 2020 election.22 After the district court in the Western District of Louisiana awarded the plaintiffs preliminary injunction-related discovery, five private individuals joined the lawsuit, with NCLA representing four of them: epidemiologists and co-authors of the Great Barrington Declaration Bhattacharya and Kulldorff, psychiatrist Aaron Kheriaty, and activist Jill Hines. The evidence provided by the plaintiffs, including that attained through the discovery process, eventually prompted the Louisiana judge to issue a preliminary injunction in favor of the plaintiffs.23 On September 8, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld much of the district court's preliminary injunction, enjoining the



the government's behest, as opposed to the platforms' independent content moderation decisions. And it rejected their protests that, without being granted discovery—which would provide access to private emails and other communications—they had no way to find out just what was going on behind the scenes and the nature and degree of the government's involvement in social media censorship.21 It was the perfect catch-22.

But the same day that the court tossed the lawsuit, the Attorneys General of Missouri and Louisiana filed another, known as Missouri v. Biden, that raised similar claims, albeit alleging censorship on a wider variety of topics, including the Hunter Biden White House, Surgeon General, CDC, and FBI from coercing or encouraging social media companies to censor content on their platforms containing protected free speech. The court acknowledged that the injunction was almost unprecedented because of the egregious nature of the government's conduct: "[W]e do not take our decision today lightly. But, the Supreme Court has rarely been faced with a coordinated campaign of this magnitude orchestrated by federal officials that jeopardized a fundamental aspect of American life. Therefore, the district court was correct in its assessment -- "unrelenting pressure" from certain government officials likely "had the intended result of suppressing millions of protected free speech postings by American citizens."



Because the judge sensibly allowed discovery to proceed in Missouri, the plaintiffs were able to buttress their legal arguments and observations with respect to the Administration's public statements with a plethora of previously nonpublic documents. This material demonstrated that using coercion, pressure, deception, collusion, and encouragement, actors within the Administration had created a sprawling censorship-by-proxy regime.24 The social media companies were not simply implementing their own policies or taking the government's advice into consideration, contrary to the defense's arguments. Rather, as explicitly stated, they were altering those policies and escalating enforcement to meet the government's relentless, explicit, and aggressive demands, often accompanied by threats of retaliation in the absence of compliance.25

As one example among many,26 internal Meta emails revealed that the platform had quashed discussion of the lab leak theory under White House pressure.27 Responding to a company executive's query as to why posts on the subject were being removed, the vice president in charge of content policy admitted, "Because we were under pressure from the administration" and conceded regretfully, "We shouldn't have done it."


It is now well-documented that National Institutes of Health (NIH) Director Dr. Anthony Fauci knew early on that the virus likely emerged from a lab in Wuhan and sought to suppress evidence to that effect. The Australian has reported that the NIH and other agencies had funded 65 scientific projects at the Wuhan Institute of Virology over the past decade, many involving risky research on bat coronaviruses. The Obama Administration had halted financial support for such research, but it was reinstated under Trump at the behest of the NIH. Robert Kadlec, former assistant secretary for preparedness and response at the Department of Health, told the Australian that "Francis Collins and Fauci both had a similar worldview, which was scientists know best and there should be few restrictions on research." On January 27, 2020, Fauci, along with several others, received an email from NIAID Chief of Staff Greg Folkers detailing the breadth and nature of coronavirus research at the Wuhan lab, which included an attachment containing talking points for Dr. Fauci. The series of the Pauci.

According to Kaldec, shortly afterward, on February 1, Fauci and several other scientists participated in a call in which they strategized ways to cast doubt on the lab leak theory publicly, all the while acknowledging the theory's validity privately. "I think Tony Fauci was trying to protect his institution and his own reputation from the possibility that his agency was funding the Wuhan Institute of Virology researchers who ... may have been working with People's Liberation Army researchers on defensive coronavirus vaccines." Put bluntly, it appears that Fauci and other NIH scientists intentionally hid evidence supporting the lab leak theory and disparaged the hypothesis publicly because of their personal culpability in funding and promoting research that may have ultimately caused the worldwide pandemic.

At this point in time, there is no unequivocal proof that the Administration suppressed the lab leak hypothesis in order to protect the reputations of either Dr. Fauci or the NIH. However, it is quite clear that Fauci tried to impugn the theory while knowing it was valid and that the White House succeeded in convincing Meta and other social media companies to censor discussion of the subject. It does not seem a bridge too far to theorize that the White House's campaign to suppress and discredit the theory stemmed from a desire to protect Fauci, who had come to be considered a political ally on the Covid front, and the NIH more generally. After all, there is no other readily apparent motive for silencing discussion on the subject.

The year 2020 was an annus horribilis due to Covid-19. Generations from now, people will look back on this period as one of the darkest hours of American history. One reason it was so dark is that the very people and institutions that Americans relied on for guidance betrayed them. They wielded their power to hide their own misdeeds, propagated falsehoods, and corrupted science to benefit corporations. Some government officials even conspired with social media companies to censor the views expressed on social media by hundreds if not thousands of people, depriving Americans of their free speech rights behind closed doors for political gain. It's no wonder that a tweet went viral recently, quipping, "What's the difference between a conspiracy theory and the truth? About six months." Sometimes, the conspiracies turn out to be true.

Climate Change Strange

IS OUR PLANET REALLY DOOMED?

Part 1

Since at least the 1960s, politicians, the media, and climate alarmists have been inundating the world with dire predictions about impending climate catastrophes. 'Global warming' became 'climate change', but the narrative mostly stayed the same from decade to decade. They would have the world believe that these predictions are based on extensive scientific study and that the conclusions reached represent a consensus in the scientific community. This could not be further from the truth. Let's examine the purported proof, the source of it, and what dissenting scientists have said.



The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is often misunderstood as a scientific body when, in fact, it is a government-funded organization. The IPCC was established in 1988 by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO).

Unlike scientific organizations that primarily rely on independent research grants and private funding, the IPCC is predominantly supported by government funds. The IPCC gets its funding from a dedicated trust fund established by the WMO in 1989. The IPCC's annual budget is funded by the 195 UN member states. In 2021, the countries contributing the most money included: The United States, Japan, France, Germany, and Norway.

The IPCC DOES NOT conduct research; the reports issued are an assessment of scientific papers. The member governments submit lists of potential authors, and the IPCC selects the authors from these government nominations. Critics have argued that some governments have used their influence within the IPCC to promote their agendas or suppress dissenting voices. More on this in the 'Climategate' section.

This government-funded, non-scientific body has been incredibly influential on a global scale. Since its inception in 1988, the IPCC has issued six assessment reports (AR1, SAR, TAR, AR4 -AR6). AR1(1990) played a decisive role in the creation of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), an international treaty aimed at "preventing dangerous human interference with the climate system." The UNFCCC was the parent treaty of the Paris Agreement of 2015. SAR (1995) was used as a cornerstone of The Kyoto Protocol in 1997, an international treaty aimed at reducing global CO2 emissions worldwide. The Fourth Assessment Report (AR4) (2007) laid the groundwork for The Copenhagen Agreement of 2009, which aimed to institute much more aggressive reductions in greenhouse gas emissions than laid out in the Kyoto Protocol. AR5, finalized between 2013 and 2014, was used to support the Paris Agreement of 2015.²



Michael Mann: The 'Hockey Stick'

In their reports, the IPCC relied very heavily on a graph from Michael Mann dubbed the 'hockey stick' due to its shape. Although the first IPCC report featured a graph that included the medieval warm period (1100-1400 AD) and the Little Ice Age (1400-1800), Mann's 'hockey stick' ignored these and focused on the time period from the Industrial Revolution until just before 2000. Hence, human-caused 'global warming'. It should be noted that Mann's "sharp" temperature increase was less than 1.5° Fahrenheit.³



In his 2015 book, A Disgrace to the Profession, Mark Steyn included statements and analyses from over 100 scientists that disputed and refuted Mann's data and conclusions. Fred Singer, research fellow at the **Independent Institute and Professor Emeritus of Environmental Sciences** at the University of Virginia, had this to say: "If one looks at the best temperature data over the last thousand years, they overwhelmingly support the existence of an oscillation on a time scale of 1000-1500 years—with a temperature maximum, the Medieval Warm Period (MWP), followed by the well documented Little Ice Age (LIA). These temperature swings are missing from Mann's HS graph—which the IPCC unwisely featured six times in its 3rd Assessment Report of 2001. It is telling that IPCC's 4th Report of 2007 and the forthcoming 5th Report no longer display the hockev stick-curve of Michael Mann."4



ClimateGate

In November 2009, hundreds of emails from the UK Climatic Research Unit at The University of East Anglia were made public. "The leaked emails revealed disturbing plans to either destroy or hide temperature data, manipulate the data to hide an observed decrease in temperature, and discussions of how to block the publications of global warming skeptics."



In response to the emails, Dr. Bruce Bunker, Ph.D., said: "[The] emails show that the 'hockey stick' is a complete fabrication, involving not only the elimination of all climate data that didn't support global warming but the inclusion of totally fictitious data."

One notable email was from Phil Jones, Director of the Climatic Research Unit at The University of East Anglia. He wrote: "I've been told that IPCC is above national FOI Acts [Freedom of Information requests, forcing the handing-over of information to the public]. One way to cover yourself and all those working in AR5 would be to delete all emails at the end of the process."

The leaked emails revealed disturbing plans to either destroy or hide temperature data, manipulate the data to hide an observed decrease in temperature, and discussions of how to block the publications of global warming skeptics.

Some of the Most Vocal Critics of the IPCC:

Dr. Richard Lindzen, Professor of Meteorology at MIT, was the lead author of chapter 7 of the IPCC Third Assessment Report. Afterward, he was critical of the report's Summary, stating, "The IPCC encourages misuse of the summary: that the summary does not reflect the full document, and that the final version was modified from the draft in a way to exaggerate man-made warming."

Dr. Frederik Saitz, a physicist and a former president of The United States Academy of Sciences, wrote in *The Wall Street Journal*, "In my more than 60 years as a member of the American scientific community, including service as president of both the National Academy of Sciences and the American Physical Society, I have never witnessed a more disturbing corruption of the peer-review process than the events that led to this IPCC report."

In an email brought to light in 'climategate', Dr. Peter Thorne, a physical geography professor, Director of the Irish Climate Analysis Research Unit S Group, and a lead author of AR5, wrote: "Observations do not show rising temperatures throughout the tropical troposphere unless you accept one single study and discount a wealth of others....I also think the science is being manipulated to put a political spin on it." ¹⁰

After the 'climategate' scandal and the awkward fact that global temperatures remained flat from 1998-2014, the term "global warming" dropped out of sight. The new catchphrase became climate change.



The 97% Consensus Lie

In 2015, the NASA website claimed that 97% of scientists agree that humans are causing catastrophic global warming. The IPCC repeatedly parroted this same 'consensus' number. Politicians, the media, and climate alarmists worldwide were quick to jump on the bandwagon. However, it was NOT TRUE. Listed below are just two examples showing that the "consensus" claim was a falsehood.¹¹

On December 11, 2008, The U.S. Senate Environment and Public Works Committee released a report entitled: "More than 700 International Scientists Dissent Over Man-Made Global Warming Claims-Science Continues to Debunk 'Consensus' in 2008." These scientists were from all parts of the globe: America, Japan, India, Russia, Canada, Norway, and other nations. The report also brought to light the fact that the IPCC claim that there was a consensus was authored by just 52 scientists.¹²



In 2008, 31,478 American scientists (including 9,021 PhDs) published the following statement: "There is no convincing scientific evidence that human release of carbon dioxide, methane, or other greenhouse gases is causing or will, in the foreseeable future, cause catastrophic heating of the Earth's atmosphere and disruption of the Earth's climate. Moreover, there is substantial scientific evidence that increases in atmospheric carbon dioxide produce many beneficial effects upon the natural plant and animal environments of the Earth." ¹³

Warming and Cooling Trends, Sea Levels, and Polar Bears

The IPCC and climate alarmists have talked endlessly about melting polar ice caps and rising sea levels. The fact that sea levels have only risen slightly in the last 5,000 years and have DECREASED slightly in the last 100 years is an inconvenient truth that has been ignored.

The earth goes through cyclical warming and cooling trends. The last mini-ice age (1400-1800) was a natural cooling period. Following that, the earth entered a natural warming phase. The natural warming trends following a mini-ice age significantly impact global climate patterns. Rising temperatures lead to the melting of snow and ice, resulting in small increases in sea levels. These are NATURALLY OCCURRING weather patterns that have been documented extensively.¹⁴

In his book, Inconvenient Facts-The Science That Al Gore Doesn't Want You to Know, Gregory Wrightstone had this to say about arctic ice melt: "Even if the Arctic ice cap were to totally melt, this would bring only a minimal increase in the sea level because seven-eighths of the icebergs are underwater, and the melting ice is replaced by melted water. Further, liquid water takes up less space than the ice from which it melts."

Another climate myth is that melting ice caps have led to a marked decrease in polar bear population, and eventually, it will lead to their extinction. However, recent studies show that polar bear populations are on the rise and have remained so for the last 10-15 years. 15

Wildfires and Heatwaves

We've all seen the headlines over the past years touting increased wildfires and heatwaves as a result of 'climate change.' Interestingly, the number of fires along with the area burned in the United States has declined by approximately 80 percent since the beginning of the 20th century. In fact, the average annual number of fire ignitions in the US declined by approximately 780 fires per year between 1991 and 2020. Of note: In 2020, more than seventy percent of all areas burned by wildfires in the United States were on federal land.¹⁶

The United States has always experienced heat waves:

1936: North American Heatwave: one of the most severe and widespread heatwaves ever recorded, where multiple states from the northern Rockies through the Plains, the Midwest, and the Ohio Valley had their hottest and driest year on record.

1954: This heatwave stretched from the Carolinas to Colorado, and over ten states experienced 100+ temperatures for 22 days. In St. Louis, three lakes died up, forcing people to ration water.

1988: The North American heatwave and drought was considered one of the deadliest weather events in 100 years.

1995: Chicago had a 5-day heatwave that resulted in nearly 700 heat-related deaths. On one afternoon, the temperature reached 106° and was combined with record-setting humidity. North American heatwaves were also recorded in 2012 and 2018. ¹⁷

After the 'climategate' scandal and the awkward fact that global temperatures remained flat from 1998-2014, the term "global warming" dropped out of sight. The new catchphrase became "climate change."





In the archives of professional football, few names resonate as dynamically as Terrell Owens. As a true athlete, charismatic showman, and believer, Owens has left a lasting mark on the NFL. His prolonged career is a testament to his remarkable talent. Beyond the touchdowns and iconic celebrations lies a life story of perseverance, hard work, and dedication.

Owens's journey to the NFL was unconventional. Selected in the third round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the San Francisco 49ers, Owens quickly established his dominance with his speed and athleticism, as well as unparalleled work ethic. His time with the 49ers foretold the remarkable career that awaited him as he went on to set records for multiple franchises, including the Philadelphia Eagles, Dallas Cowboys, and Cincinnati Bengals.

Beyond football, Terrell Owens's life has been interwoven with his steadfast faith. He credits his relationship with God as the guiding force that has fueled his perseverance in the face of adversity. Owens's faith became an anchor during turbulent times, including highly publicized controversies and clashes with teammates. His journey through life's highs and lows echoes the resilience he displayed on the football field, reinforcing the connection between his spiritual beliefs and his unwavering commitment to excellence.

Owens's openness about his faith serves as an example for aspiring athletes, showing that one's spiritual foundation can be a source of strength and inspiration in all aspects of life.

We caught up with the man known as "T.O." to discuss his football career, his unyielding faith, and his post-football pursuits that continue to interest us. Through the triumphs and tribulations, Terrell Owens remains an icon of perseverance and a symbol of faith.

RWB: How old were you when you realized you could be an elite athlete?

TO: Elite? I'd probably say after my third year in the league, so I may have been 27 or 26? That was on the cusp of me starting to realize that I had the skill set to play at an elite level. It wasn't quite there my first two or three years. I think after I made the catch in '98 against the Packers, which was pretty much, I guess, a steppingstone for me as far as the progression of my abilities to play the receiver position.

There was a lot of rawness to my game that needed a lot of fine-tuning. I think I owe a lot of that to my receiver coaches. Namely, in the first few years, Larry Kirksey, who obviously coached Jerry Rice for a number of years and won in the Super Bowl with him and John Taylor.

When I came in in '96, I had no earthly idea of what I was going to become, what I was going to do on the football field; I was just fortunate and thankful for the opportunity that the Niners gave me to draft me in the third round, 89th pick. I've always been competitive. I wouldn't say that I was a football player, per se, but I was an athlete.



RWB: Some people may not know this, but aside from football at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, you played in the 1995 NCAA basketball tourney. In your senior year of college, you anchored your school's 4 x 100 relay team at the NCAA championship. What do you attribute your talent to? Is it all hard work? Or is it something more?

TO: Desire, dedication, and discipline. Everybody has their own path and journey to wherever they want to be or go, wherever their mind takes them. Even when you think of little kids, they dream. It's all about wherever their mind takes them, their mindset. When I think about how I got to be a Hall of Famer and how I was able to do the things that I did, I attribute it number one to me being just competitive.

I wanted to win. I saw and realized that in high school, I didn't have that four or five-star talent. I lived in Alabama; I didn't get to go to Auburn, which was 45 minutes from me. I didn't get to go to the University of Alabama, which would have been my dream to go to the University of Alabama and play for the Crimson Tide. It wouldn't have been to go to the National Football League because, honestly, I didn't think I had the ability to play at that level.

When I think about my three pillars of success and how I got to be where I am, it's still those three D's that I just mentioned. I think the most unique thing about me, and where I was at that time growing up as a kid, I was a realist. I saw that my skill set wasn't as good as my peers around me. I wasn't as fast as the guys around me, I wasn't as big, I wasn't as strong as the guys around me. So, I knew I had to do something to get on that level in order to play.

By the time I left high school, I still hadn't really developed into the athlete mentally that I wanted to be, so I was a late bloomer. I had to dedicate myself, obviously, to getting in the weight room and doing the necessary things that the coaches asked me. I took to heart everything that they told me. I dedicated myself to the weight room.

Then, I think the discipline part didn't really come until I got to the pros. I saw that I literally was not where I needed to be as a rookie, as a second-year guy, or as a third-year guy.

There was a lot of maturation that I had to do and a lot of development and enhancement of a lot of deficiencies in my game to become a receiver.

The discipline part is what I really homed in to, which separated me, I think, from a number of guys when you look at the '96 draft. There are a lot of good guys that came out of college that were drafted; 11 or 12 of those guys went before me.

I remember being in Chattanooga just watching college games, watching these guys play in front of 80,000 to 100,000 fans. I don't think we played in front of that many people with all the years combined at Chattanooga, to be quite honest.

So, to answer your question -- how I got to be who I am and accomplish the things that I did -- again, I live by those three Ds: desire, dedication, and discipline. In order to reach the highest level of success, you have to dedicate yourself. When we think about all the greats to play in every sport, there's only a handful of them. Discipline is what separates the great from the good.



RWB: It's weird to hear you say that you weren't that good early on, for you to have been so honest with yourself like that. A lot of kids tend to have an inflated sense of ego when they're young, where you are real with yourself. Speaking of youth sports, do you have a strong opinion about young kids specializing in one sport?

TO: I think parents should allow them to play multiple sports. Over time, you can overuse your muscle groups. When I talk about this, I really think about baseball players. Pitchers, for example. They're so great, whether coming from college, straight to the pros or if they come from



the minors. Just think about all the hours of practice, especially pitchers. Think about the number of hundreds and thousands of throws that they do throughout the course of the year, and they're basically just breaking down their muscles, just overusing them. Then, when it gets to the pros, they have a good first year. They're throwing high velocity and then go into that second year, and suddenly they need to have surgery, and they're out. You never really hear from them anymore, depending on how their recovery from the surgery goes.

I think you should be able to train your other muscle groups. Most of the sports are hand-eye coordination. When you play different sports, it enables you to really use those other muscle groups, still being able to strengthen and utilize your hand-eye coordination. When parents ask me about it, I always say let him play multiple sports. I think a lot of parents pigeonhole these kids to play one sport because they feel like if they just devote enough time to it, they're going to become professionals; they are going to become really great at it.

Not to say that they won't but look at what I did. I never thought I would become a professional football player. And I love basketball; I played baseball, I ran track, but there's thousands of other examples of athletes that specialized in other sports. But then they realize, okay, I have a unique skill and innate ability in this (other) sport.

It gives the body time to rest and utilize other muscle groups because once they continue to get into it, and let's say they do go pro, then now they're really having to exercise and train and use those muscles to the highest level. You want to maximize the output, and then think about all those years leading up to that; you've burnt the kid out. So, it's always good to do something else. Let those kids be kids.

RWB: Of all the teams you played for in the NFL, with which city or team do you feel like you grew the most?

TO: Probably Philly or Dallas. I played eight years in San Francisco, and right around 2002/2003, I was starting to peak, or I was at the height of my career where I just felt like there was really nothing anybody could do to stop me other than probably double to triple-teaming me. I went to Dallas, and I actually saw and beat a lot of double coverage. I had never seen anything like it. I didn't know what was going on. But that was a moment when I was like, man, I'm something special. Philly is where I was able to really flourish. I think a lot of people got to see my speed and got to see me kind of unleash the abilities of a receiver.

RWB: From the outside looking in, many would agree there was a concerted effort to push out certain social justice or political narratives through sports and entertainment. I feel like in the last ten years, it's really increased. Would you agree? Or is this just something noticed from the outside?

TO: I think it's always been there. It's just never really been talked about. I think Colin Kaepernick opened a can of worms, so to speak. And I think it was rightfully done. The way he did it, a lot of people didn't agree and still don't agree. Racism exists, and people just don't talk about it. I think now people are being more outspoken, utilizing the platforms in order to share their views and their thoughts on such things as social injustice. Even when I had moments with the media or I spoke out about certain things that I either agreed with or didn't agree with, it was frowned upon.

I wasn't one of those guys that kind of, I guess in so many ways, played the political game or spoke politically correct. That's not how I was raised. I didn't really understand what playing the politically correct game meant. I was so engulfed in just trying to learn and be a professional football player, and I wasn't so into the politics of the game. As I got older and started to see how people view some of the things that I either would say or do, I would go to my coach and I would ask him like, "Yo, what am I doing?" "Did I do something wrong?" "Did I say something wrong?" And I'm thankful for Coach Kirksey. I'm thankful for George Stewart, who replaced coach Kirksey as the receiver coach.

I leaned heavily on those guys, and I appreciate those guys because they were like my father figures. They were like my brothers and uncles that I didn't have growing up. When I went to Dallas, there was Ray Sherman, another black coach, and another black man, a father figure that I leaned on when there was turmoil or tension. I guess in the media's eyes, for me, there was controversy. I would lean on those guys. I would ask Coach, "Did I do something wrong?" They would tell me you're not doing anything wrong; it's just that they didn't want to hear me say what I had to say. I was being honest. I saw it was mostly the white counterparts.



As far as racism and things of that nature, my grandmama would say to always try and see the good in people. And so, I didn't see black and white. I didn't see the racism like she did growing up. As a kid, you don't understand those things. But for her, she lived it. Her mom and dad lived it. They lived in the segregation era. So, I didn't comprehend what she was teaching us.

Now, as an adult, I'm starting to sense, feel, and see some of the same things she spoke of. My coach always told me to "be your own man." Be who you are, always be honest, don't change anything about it. And so, I never did. People have perceptions of me based on the media portrayal of my 15 years, and a lot of people think that I'm arrogant, a lot of people think that I'm cocky. A lot of people frown upon doing touchdown celebrations; as if I created the touchdown celebration, they were doing that before me. I just tried to have fun with the game the best that I could, and again, I got vilified for playing a kid's game.

RWB: How did you come up with all these touchdown dances?

TO: Well, I guess I can attribute it to my mama and my grandmama. My grandmama didn't really want me to play sports, and my dad never came to any of my games. We were 6A, a pretty good football team every year. My mom never came to any games. I think maybe it may have been my junior year, and she came to a game. I wasn't playing. I wasn't starting. I barely played. I think it was a junior varsity game or something like that, and I made a couple of catches here and there. Then I asked her, when I got home, "Did you see my catches?" And she goes, "What number were you?" So, I was like, man, she was clueless about sports. But again, she came, and it was support. I always remember her asking me that.

Fast forward years later, I'm in the pros, and I'm playing for the 49ers, one of the primetime teams that play on primetime TV. In my first years, obviously, I played on a lot of special teams. And so, I always knew the TV games, so I'm like, okay, if I ever score, I know the cameras will be on me. I knew she was going to be watching, so I was like, man, if I score, I'm going to do a dance. I was living in Atlanta at the time, and they had a dance called the "Bankhead bounce" or something like that. So, when I scored my first touchdown, that's how it all started. I'm like, okay, there's no way she'll be able to miss the dance, and I'm sure by this time, she obviously knew my number. So that was kind of the beginning of it. I got Steve Young to do the dance as well. So that was a really fun time.



RWB: What was your most expensive fine from these dances (Laughing)?

TO: Ah, I don't know, to be quite honest. I don't know if I got fined early on. I think that the only one I got fined for was when I went to the star in Dallas, and I think maybe one other one. I think I may have been in Philly or Dallas at the time, and they made up these rules where you couldn't use anything on the field as a prop. It was around the Olympics or something, where Track and Field was going on, and I think I had scored a long touchdown, and I kind of used the gold line like it's the tape. Then I turned around, and I got down into a track stance. So, because I put my hands down on that... Honestly, I don't know what my fines were; I never really paid attention to it, to be quite honest.



RWB: It's comical now, looking back.

TO: I think a lot of people when they look back on my career -- I don't tend to try to take any credit -- but a lot of people are like, dude, you are kind of a pioneer in so many ways. Because they vilified you for the touchdown celebrations, the league took it away for a number of years, or maybe a year or so, and the viewership decreased. There was a decline in viewership because it was a No Fun League. Then they brought it back.

RWB: We talked earlier about how you didn't feel like you were the fastest or strongest in the beginning. And now you're in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. What advice would you give to young athletes who maybe aren't where they want to be yet athletically?

TO: Keep striving, I mean, just keep working. For me, personally, things just kind of just fell in my lap.

Things just kind of aligned. Everybody's steps are ordered by the Lord. I just never thought I would play in the National Football League, and then once I got in the league, I ended up having people pop up in my life at random times that helped me along the way. I think a lot of kids need to be receptive to people who are older, advising them, directing them, and giving them guidance on how to be a better athlete, not just doing the necessary things that

you're supposed to do. I would tell kids to be receptive; you don't know everything, and even with my son, I was trying to kind of give him the ropes, kind of guide him a bit. But you know, when kids grow to be grown, or they think they're grown, and they think they know everything, they're not as receptive to a lot of information, and you can't blame any one thing. You can't really blame the kids. Like, you just have to blame social media, if you have to blame. Blame highlights, because a lot of kids think highlights are 'the art'; it's like training reels or teaching tapes. For greatness, you're only seeing the benefits of what they've done beyond those highlights, and they just can't grasp it or don't want to grasp it.

RWB: You mentioned God, and I know you're a Christian. How important has your faith been in your journey?

TO: Oh, man, it's tremendously important. I know that without it, I wouldn't be who I am. I owe that wholeheartedly to my grandmama for how she raised me and brought me up. In the south, it's football and church. That's it. Sports and church, and in the house of a grandmama, it is church first, and everything else falls underneath that. So, I went to church whenever she went to church. She wanted to instill in us some morals.

I used my faith to get me through a lot of tough times early on in my career. I think I exercised my faith the most when I got hurt in Philly. The doctors said that with the injury I had sustained, there would be no way I would be able to play in the Super Bowl, which was about seven weeks away.

That was one of the moments that I remember most. It wasn't even really about playing in the game. I just remember my grandmama telling me, "When you have faith in God, you can do anything you put your mind to." That was my main focus: to be healthy, to get healthy. But the things that I had done to prepare myself to become a football player, taking care of my body nutrition-wise, throughout the course of the year, and then I went into the rehab part. Ultimately, my faith was to really show people, especially doctors -- and I understand their profession and what they do -- but they just don't have the last say.

"So yeah, faith has been very key for me"

I remember one of the catches that I made on the sideline. Honestly, I don't even know how I caught it. I came out of the break, Donovan threw the ball, and I stretched out as far as I could stretch. I just put my hands out, and the ball was in my hand. And I'm like, man, this is crazy, wow. I got nine balls thrown to me, from my recollection, and I caught all nine balls. Honestly, had I got an opportunity for one or two more passes, we would have won that game. We would have won the Super Bowl.

So yeah, faith has been very key for me, and it's something that you can't explain to people if you haven't really experienced it or don't truly believe that you can achieve something when it doesn't seem possible. Then you just don't know what faith is.

RWB: Athletes usually choose numbers for their jerseys that mean something to them. Why did you choose 81?

TO: My first year in college, I was 88. And then, in my sophomore year, I switched to 80. Because I think I saw 88 as a tight-end number, and I wanted to be a receiver. That's what I played in JV was tight-end, so the 88 to 85 were like tight-end numbers.

I didn't want to be a tight end, so I just went to the next available number, which I think was 80. I didn't even really know anything about Jerry Rice wearing it until my junior year. In college, I went into the dorm rooms, and our teammates were watching a Monday night game, and that was my first glimpse of who Jerry Rice was. At that point in time, I was two years from being drafted or not even knowing if I would be drafted. I didn't know I was going to be going to the San Francisco 49ers. So, I wore 80 in college. I didn't think I would get 80 off Jerry's back with the 49ers.

Then, in training camp, you had to kind of earn a receiver number. I was 15 in preseason, and I was scared to death. I thought I was going to get cut because I was drafted in the third round, 89th pick. One guy, a second-round pick, got cut, and I was scared. I was like, oh my gosh if he got cut, I'm definitely getting cut. So, I really got scared and started working hard. My coach told me, "You're going to be around here for a while. You just keep doing what you're doing." That gave me confidence.

So, I'm still wearing 15, and as the cuts start to dwindle and the season gets closer, I saw 81 on a receiver. I'm starting to look and see what numbers are available. I saw 81. I eyed it, but the guy was pretty good that was wearing it, so I thought, let me try and figure out what number I'm going to get. I think prior to the main roster, after that last cut, that number became available, and I'm like, I want 81.

And that's how I ended up getting 81, and it's always stuck. It stuck all the way until I got to Seattle.

Golden Tate had the number 81, and he didn't want to give it to me, so I had to wear the number 10.

That's probably why I didn't have any good luck in Seattle, to be quite honest, because I ended up getting cut. In preseason, I was wearing number 10; it was an odd look. Sometimes you want to think, new number, new look, or whatever, new places, but 10-- it just didn't have a good look for me.

RWB: What are you looking to do now? What's the next move for you?

TO: For me, it's to be entrepreneurial and be a dad. I think over the years, playing on different teams and my kids not being in the same city where I play made it difficult to spend a lot of time with them. Since I've stopped playing, I've been able to spend more time with my kids.

Becoming a Hall of Famer enables a lot of opportunities to come your way, and so during the pandemic, I think everybody kind of shifted and pivoted to do different things. I was no different. I ended up creating a wine line under the Tom Lasorda, Lasorda Family Wines line. I have my own wine called Eighty-One. It's a Cabernet, and I've made two batches. I did a 2017 Cabernet, which was a blend, and now I have a 100% Cab, which is my Hall of Fame edition. It's 2018, commemorating my Hall of Fame induction year.

And I love fashion, home decor, and things of that nature. I've been trying to get this clothing line off the ground. It's called Prototype 81. Again, there's the number and prototype. I came up with the name prototype because of how I was evaluated coming out of college when they were scouting me. I kept hearing that I was a "prototypical type of receiver." The definition of prototype is "the basis on which something is made a form."

And if you think about it, you know, from a biological or a DNA thing. We were all prototypes in our own right. We're all made and formed in our mom's womb, and you come out, and whatever you do with your life, that's on you. Whatever we put our minds to or have an ambition for or aspire to be or do. That's all part of our prototype. Then, when you look at the word "prototype," you can't spell the word prototype without "TO." The line is made up of hoodies, joggers, crop tops, and leggings, so unisex athleisure.

I grew up with my mom. She was a seamstress. In our town, Alexander City, probably 90% of the town worked at Russell Athletic, which was in my hometown during the 70s, 80s, and 90s. Then manufacturing and the ways to mass produce things put Russell Athletic out of business. A lot of jobs were lost, so people started to move away.

I always loved and liked fashion, and my mom wanted to do some of the things that
I was able to do now that I was playing in the
National Football League. It afforded me the
opportunity to do a lot of things that she wanted to
do growing up, but it was cut short because she had
kids at an early age. And then my grandmama had
to help raise us, but in order to keep the lights on,
keep food on the table, and make ends meet, not
only did she work at Russell, but she sewed on the
side, doing alterations.

She made dresses; she could make anything. She still does to this day. Even for my niece and my daughters, she makes them matching outfits. She makes shoes, she does all types of stuff. As I was growing up, her sewing machine was right in front of my bedroom. She worked constantly to the point where she didn't want just to get up and down. Literally, I had to crawl up under the chair to get in and out of the room because she was always sewing and making clothes. That's always been a passion, you know, creating a clothing line. Now, I'm afforded the opportunity to do it. It's kind of slow now because, at the height of my career, if I had done this while I was playing, you know, clothes would be flying off the shelf. This new generation of kids doesn't know much about me, but being a Hall of Famer does give me a little bit of notoriety and recognition.

RWB: You still have plenty of notoriety. I'll assure you of that.

TO: Yeah. I've got the candle line as well.
It's called Loft81Home. Anybody who knows
anything about me on a personal level knows that I
love home decor. I love candles. I had a friend of
mine who has come into a number of my homes, and
she saw that I had candles, and she already had an
existing candle line. So, I partnered up with her to
do a candle line.





RWB: Awesome, we will look for those. Thank you for your time today, T.O.!

Aside from his entrepreneurial endeavors, Owens played an integral role in the creation of "The ICON Hall of Fame", a new hall of fame in which only former players can nominate and vote to induct their colleagues. After the NFL inducted Terrell Owens on his 3rd ballot when many agreed he was a 1st ballot player, a former player named Chidi Ahanotu came up with the idea for The ICON. After eventually being inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, Owens opted not to participate in the Pro Football Hall Of Fame (PFHOF) induction ceremonies. He opted rather to hold his own induction ceremony at his college alma mater, the University Tennessee at Chattanooga.

This bold historic move brought intense attention to the inner workings of the already beleaguered Pro Football Hall of Fame. Much scrutiny has been hurled over the years at the folks at Canton, where the Hall of Fame is located, on how, when, and which players are inducted.

The ICON is quintessentially the brainchild of not only Owens, but also Deion "Prime Time" Sanders, who publicly proclaimed a need for a new pro football hall of fame. After Ahanotu fine-tuned the idea, he reached out to his NFL brothers and formed The ICON Board Of Directors. Terrell Owens was the first player to join The ICON Board. The other players who would join Owens as Founders of The ICON are a star-studded cast: the legendary Quarterback Dan Pastorini, iconic running backs Garrison Hearst and Ricky Williams, Super Bowl Champion Femi Ayanbadejo, All Pro defensive back Tony Parrish, and Super Bowl Champion offensive lineman Derrick Deese.

Owens states The ICON was formed as a way to serve former players, not to be adversarial to the existing Pro Football Hall of Fame. The PFHOF has its own method of operation and has served NFL players for many generations. With The ICON Hall Of Fame, thanks in large part to Owens, former players can now pay tribute to their own peers they believe are deserving of recognition.

Ballot Harvesting:

HOW POLITICAL PARTIES CAN USE IT TO CHEAT THE VOTE

Ballot harvesting, also known as ballot collection, is the practice of collecting and delivering absentee or mail-in ballots by a third party, such as a campaign worker, a volunteer, or a paid agent. Ballot harvesting is legal in some states, such as California, Colorado, and Nevada, but illegal or restricted in others, such as Arizona, Florida, and Texas. Ballot harvesting has been a controversial topic in recent elections, as both major political parties have accused each other of using it to manipulate the outcome of close races.

Supporters of ballot harvesting argue that it increases voter participation, especially among marginalized groups, such as **minorities**, **seniors**, **and people with disabilities**, who may face barriers to voting in person or mailing their ballots. They also claim that ballot harvesting is a form of civic engagement and community service, as it allows trusted individuals or organizations to assist voters with their ballots and ensure that they are delivered on time and according to the rules.

The question also arises regarding the need for ballot harvesting, given the availability of other options for voting, such as early voting, drop boxes, and curbside voting.

Both political parties have used ballot harvesting in different ways and to different extents in recent elections. In 2018, Democrats benefited from ballot harvesting in California, where they flipped several House seats in districts that had voted for President Trump in 2016. In some cases, Democrat harvesters collected hundreds of ballots each and delivered them to election offices. Republicans accused Democrats of abusing the practice and violating the state law that allows only designated family members or caregivers to collect ballots.

In 2020, Republicans embraced ballot harvesting in states where it was legal or not explicitly prohibited, such as Pennsylvania, North Carolina, and Minnesota. In some cases, Republican harvesters collected ballots from churches, nursing homes, and military bases. Democrats accused Republicans of hypocrisy and double standards, as they had previously denounced ballot harvesting as fraudulent and illegal.



Naturally, Democrats were upset as Republicans were now utilizing Democrat tactics.

Ballot harvesting remains a contentious issue in American politics as both parties seek to gain an edge in competitive elections. As more states expand their absentee and mail-in voting options, which started with the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond, the debate over ballot harvesting is likely to continue and intensify.

Inside the Capitol for Thirty-Seven Seconds, Then Threatened with Prison Lock-Up

As this story was being prepared for the press, 34-year-old Daniel Goodwyn --- a citizen journalist who had spent 37 seconds walking inside and exiting the U.S. Capitol on January 6, 2021 --- was reporting to federal prison.

In efforts to help defend their son against U.S. prosecutors, Goodwyn's parents were forced to deplete their retirement fund --- his legal defense cost \$100,000. Many would agree that bankrupting J6 protestors and their families, while exhausting and intimidating them, certainly appears to be a goal.

On the somber day of incarceration checkin, Goodwyn's parents accompanied him to Chick-fil-A for a last-decent lunch. Then, they drove to the prison and watched him walk inside for the humiliating intake process. He was given no guarantee of regular contact with the outside world.

Welcome to 2023 in an America that is teetering toward tyranny, where many are concerned that --- if an average citizen holds political views opposed to the current regime in power --- then he or she could end up paying --- in more ways than one.

This is a profile about Goodwyn, who went to Washington (joining a massive crowd that fateful day) to "petition the government for a redress of grievances. We wanted to assemble peaceably and to peacefully and patriotically make our voices heard," he said.

Goodwyn's "37-seconds-in-the-Capitol" story and that of his employer David Sumrall, who spoke about the book *American Gulag Chronicles*, were separately featured when interviewed by Fox News's Tucker Carlson on *Tucker Carlson Tonight*. Those airings occurred the week before Carlson was ousted for reasons still murky and unknown. Some speculate that 'too much truth' was being broadcast by Carlson.

According to Goodwyn and others on-site, at some point, the Capitol Police (regarded as a private security force reporting to the Speaker of the House and the Senate) --- and the Metro D.C. Police (who ultimately report to Democrat Mayor Muriel Bowser) --- teargassed and launched concussion grenades into the huge crowd. What happened that day was a complex scene, but it is clear things devolved from there. A large amount of video evidence is available on the website StopHate.com.

The United States District Court for the District of Columbia --- in the case of the United States of America vs. Daniel Goodwyn --- had to admit that Goodwyn did not commit violence nor hurt anyone. The prosecutors contend Goodwyn allegedly used a bullhorn, didn't leave immediately, and did not appear "remorseful" during the Tucker Carlson TV interview. They argued he was at risk for "recidivism" into more "criminal behavior."

As federal prosecutors have done with so many others, they stacked violations (misdemeanors, five in all) such as "parading, demonstrating and picketing in a Capitol building." Goodwyn spent about a year under house arrest, wearing an ankle monitor 24-7, before trial.

Here are highlights from his ordeal and an interview with Renee' for the Republic, Contributing Writer for *George*. **RR**: Please introduce yourself to the readers with anything they should know about you, including your faith journey.

DG: My name is Daniel Goodwyn. I work with David Sumrall (founder) at Stop Hate. I have loved Jesus since I was a kid. My mom walked me through the "Romans Road" when I was five because she was telling me about hell, and I told her I didn't want to go there.

I joined the 24/7 Prayer Movement when I was on the first of two nationwide tours with TheCauseUSA in the summers of 2006 and 2007. I was with the Justice House of Prayer in San Francisco. I joined the Firebase Movement in 2014 and started working at Jews for Jesus as a Web Designer in May 2016.


RR: A lot of the younger generation appear atheistic. They do not see a problem with socialism, Marxism, anything-goes immorality, or concocting "your own truth." They're already okay with not ever owning a home; they comply when the government says to wear a mask or take an injection (or, coming soon, get a digital "passport"). They're fearful of over-hyped-up climate change, they believe America is racist and corrupt, and they are being encouraged to disdain Christians. They seem far from being patriots. How did you avoid those ideologies?

DG: I think we are in the End Times, and there is a great delusion - the spirit of this age. We know that we are from God, but the entire world lies in the power of the evil one. 1 John 5:19. The enemy is using communism and globalism, etc., to deceive the masses.

I would say that God protected me from believing these lies and gave me the courage to stand up against them. My parents raised me in a wholesome Christian household.

I was diagnosed with autism last year. People with autism can sometimes be very stubborn about the truth. There are pros and cons to this, but one of the pros for me has been taking the Bible literally and logically applying it to my life.

The Bible says not to be anxious. I'm not anxious. The Bible says to tell the truth. I tell the truth. A political solution will not come without a miracle. We need to follow the instructions in 2 Chronicles 7:14.

RR: Tell us about your work and how you got involved in J6. What were you there to do? Did you have any trepidation at all about going to the Capitol? Were people being ushered in by the Capitol and/or D.C. police?

DG: I met David while doing #DemandFreeSpeech rallies (2019 SF, DC, Miami). I was a co-organizer for those against big tech censorship. He was a sponsor and speaker. I got into that doing free speech activism in San Francisco, including making posters of people who were "wanted" for "thought crimes."

I covered some Trump rallies after lockdowns started easing. I got arrested for not wearing a mask on a bus in San Francisco. After that, we did #StopTheSteal rallies across the country.

Then, on January 6, 2021, I wanted to go. I didn't want to be forced to wear a mask on an airplane, so I drove. I left just after New Year's Eve. I thought I would have plenty of time to get to D.C. --- but I got arrested for not wearing a mask at a gas station Taco Bell in Wyoming, so I barely made it to D.C. for J6 on time. We had

planned to have a group photo-op and prayer time at the Washington Monument before the rally, but neither of us made it there in time for that.

In addition to prayer and religion, citizen journalism, and press, I obviously wanted to express my freedom of speech to support election integrity, America, and Trump.

It was supposed to be a protest to petition the government for a redress of grievances. We wanted to peaceably assemble to "peacefully and patriotically" make our voices heard.

To support the lawful objection process by Cruz and Gosar and see if the (states) would investigate for ten days and take a (forensic) look at the voter fraud allegations. We didn't intend to obstruct any kind of proceeding, official or otherwise. Nobody had a plan to go inside the building. The thought didn't enter our minds. To this day, I haven't heard of anyone who suggested that before January 6, besides Ray Epps on January 5. Soros' *Media Matters* was not happy that we pointed that out.

I meandered up to the building and didn't have trepidation about going in because there was a whole line of police standing around doing nothing as people were going in and out of the wide-open door. I even said my name on a livestream. I obviously didn't feel like I was doing anything wrong. See my videos. I wouldn't say people were being "ushered" in by the police where I was at that time. But they did usher people past the gates, at least on the East side toward the beginning, and they also enticed people into the tunnel toward the beginning of that situation.

RR: What did you witness (good, bad, and ugly?)

DG: See the videos at StopHate.com. I was joking around at the rally beforehand. I was trolling the news media --- wandering around, having a good time, enjoying the positive vibes. I've never seen that many people in one place at one time before. It was beautiful and patriotic.

I literally didn't witness anything bad or ugly that day. All of that I have seen since then (in videos by citizen journalists). StopHate.com has the five-deaths article and the death-count article. That tells most of the main things regarding that.

RR: Speak about who was hurt and how.

DG: So much information is at StopHate.Com. In addition to the deaths, we know some names of protestors who were brutalized:

- · Joshua Matthew Black was shot in the face.
- Derrick Bargo was shoved off the wall by Bryant Williams.
- Victoria White was beaten with a police baton.
- Protesters were tear-gassed in the middle of a prayer

RR: Would the National Guard being there have helped? Is it true Pelosi and D.C. Mayor Bowser said no to that offer by President Trump?

DG: They would have guarded the restricted area, and nobody would have been arrested for trespassing. It was a setup. We have the testimony of Kash Patel (who worked with President Trump), the actual document, and the Tweet from the mayor.

RR: You believe it was a setup. Speak to the evidence.

DG: It was obviously a setup. Regardless of whether Ray Epps was a Fed (federal) asset trying to entrap people, there were many deep-state leaders involved in the setup (fedsurrection). See the section on the website

about deep-state leaders under Stop Hate J6 Research. Antifa was there, admitted. There were many agitators and suspicious actors there. There were secret agents there, including those embedded within the Oath Keepers, Proud Boys, and Three Percenters, before the fact (event). There was a lot of intelligence shared beforehand, so they knew that security was needed. See it all on the Stop Hate Intel page.

The most obvious thing is they entrapped people into a "crime" of "trespassing." And instigated violence against peaceful protesters. The narrative was ready right away, and the distraction began immediately, away from the 'election fraud' coup and the attack and persecution and prosecution of Trump.

RR: Why do some people believe it was an insurrection of domestic far-right "terrorists"? Can an insurrection take place with no guns? But the leftists say flagpoles and fire extinguishers were used as weapons, etc.

DG: Literally, people just believe the fake news narrative. They don't think critically. Or for themselves. The division is so deep that people lose empathy for their fellow man. It's part of the brainwashing and part of the plan.

You obviously can't stage a successful insurrection with no guns --- and obviously, the 2A supporting crowd didn't have that in mind, or they would have come armed.

RR: When and how did you learn you were in trouble? Take us to that date and time, what you were doing, how you were notified, and how you felt.

DG: Journalists called me when my criminal complaint became public. The FBI called me on the phone. I was visiting my family in Texas on the way back to San Francisco. It was pretty surreal. The complaint was on January 15th. The FBI started tracking my phone on the 22nd.

They raided my parent's house on the 29th, arrested me, and confiscated my MAGA hat and all my electronic devices. When I was in jail, I felt like there was a communist takeover, and I didn't know if I would ever be free again.

RR: I've heard it said that the leftists aren't after simply convictions but putting people through the process and making them political hostages. Bankrupting them. If so, please describe.

DG: Yes, that's true. I was banned from Stripe, which is a back-end payment processing platform --- also banned from many other things, like Facebook, Instagram, Airbnb, Lyft, a dating app called Hinge, and more. PayPal bans us. Banks ban us. People have had their funds frozen by the feds. Put on no-fly lists. Subpoenas to Big Tech and phone companies about us. Subpoenas from the J6 committee. George Soros' Media Matters came against us for having a fundraiser page.

The prosecution copied and pasted the amount I had raised in my fundraiser into their sentencing memo, asking for the government to fine me that exact amount. The judge wanted to do it too but decided not to because they all knew I didn't have any money.



RR: What was it like in jail? How were you treated? Were there police inside who sided with J6ers but couldn't say anything?

DG: It was bad in jail, but I think it is for everyone. The guards ignore you. I had to beg for a Bible. I asked for a chaplain every day and never saw one. The food was awful. The sleep schedule they get you on because of the meal schedule is disorienting. It was too cold. They had me in solitary and blamed "Covid quarantine."

No police or guards or staff or anyone discussed J6 with me in there. I was in a county jail here in Texas. It was/is/ will be worse for those in the D.C. gulag for sure. There have been reports of not getting a medically required correct diet, being beaten and abused by guards, being sent to the SHU (isolation facility) unjustly, having privileges removed wrongly --- the list goes on.

RR: Have a lot of J6ers caved and turned under pressure upon Trump?

DG: A few, not a lot.

RR: How has this ordeal affected families?

DG: Families are devastated. Especially when the father is in prison, and he is the breadwinner. Imagine that.

Their family was held at gunpoint by the FBI as they shined their laser sights from the semi-automatic rifles at them. During the raid, armored tactical vehicles and police vehicles surrounded their home.

RR: How did you find a lawyer, and what has that cost you financially?

DG: I found McBride from seeing him do interviews on TV. He represented other J6ers. The bill was \$100,000. I paid what I could, and my parents paid the rest. I'm raising money to pay them back the difference. I had a Donorbox run by David. I now have a GiveSendGo run by my mom.

RR: Who has helped get you through this?

DG: My parents and brothers and their churches have supported me and the J6 community. And especially David and Stop Hate.

My mom gave me the scripture reference Ephesians 6:10 when I was arrested. The Lord gave me the scripture Zechariah 9:11-12 while I was in there.

RR: Would you go again? Are you afraid to speak out now? Or has this fueled a fire in you to fight goons to the gates of hell?

DG: Go where? To D.C.? I don't like D.C., and I'd like to avoid it. Or is this about prison? Is this a hypothetical time-travel question? If it's about time travel, I would warn Trump and the other patriots that it was a PSYOP setup and to be careful.

I practiced my 5th Amendment for two and a half years, and I'm transitioning back into practicing my First Amendment. I only fear God. I have focused and will continue to focus much of my energy on exonerating those wrongfully charged, convicted, and sentenced in regard to J6.

I will continue to share the Gospel. I will continue to advocate for Christianity, America, the Constitution, the Declaration of Independence, Trump, free speech, pro-life causes, etc. If God is with me, who can be against me?

RR: How did it feel to be on Tucker? Did you get help stemming from that?

DG: I appreciate that he was spreading the truth and letting me tell people how they could help. Most of my donations came in before the episode. A few came in after.

RR: Anything you'd like to add or how people can help your situation? Including if you're looking for a good job, etc.

DG: I'm happily working for David at Stop Hate, but I may be interested in getting back into tech one day. It would be cool to work at a free speech platform like Gab, for example. David is just a carpenter and not rich. Not a lot of people help fund us. Here's how people can help me and other J6ers:

An Air Force Veteran and Patriot Tells His J6 Story From A Cell



Alan Fischer III, also known as "AJ," is a 28-year-old Air Force Veteran who remains a prisoner, detained in the Pinellas County Jail in Clearwater, FL. He was charged with "assaulting, resisting or impeding an officer, violent entry and disorderly conduct on Capitol grounds Jan. 6, 2021."

Fischer writes from his cell: "I pen this statement as a prisoner held without bond. I, an honorably discharged and decorated United States Air Force veteran, have coordinated and supervised missions inclusive of transporting former president Obama via Marine One, multiple U.S. Secret Service, and Seal Team Six movements --- both here in the U.S. and around the world...

"On the advice of counsel, while I cannot comment at the time about any details of my ongoing case as a J6 defendant, I do wish to shed light on the police brutality I witnessed at the hands of the Capitol Police...

...This brutality included the use of both lethal and non-lethal force against a patriotic flag-waving crowd. We found ourselves under the assault of a barrage of flash-bang grenades, rubber bullets, chemical weapons, and other potentially deadly or dangerous projectiles," Fischer writes.

...This peaceful attempt to exercise First Amendment rights quickly transformed into what resembled war zones I've seen as a combat veteran. Had a service member such as myself used such force against an innocent group of civilians in any other part of the world, they would have been duly court-martialed and prosecuted for violations of the Geneva Convention."

Fischer continues: "The violence I witnessed this day has been largely ignored by the mainstream media and government investigators, who selectively frame events of that day as an "insurrection" for inherent political gain...

...As non-convicted political prisoners, we are being denied basic constitutional rights, such as detention without bond, unnecessary delays in court hearings, secure access to legal counsel, and protection from cruel and unusual inhumane punishment.

...It is my goal to have my voice assist in serving justice for patriots from J6 – in addition to helping guarantee the Constitutional right to peaceful assembly in the future," Fischer writes.



The Patriots were trying to pre-empt the issue of overpaying someone based on a past performance that isn't statistically likely to be replicated in the future. This phenomenon is most clearly illustrated in the big-money contracts of Major League Baseball in the post-steroid era. Those 10-year deals for hundreds of millions of dollars that are given to players on the wrong side of 30 years old don't seem to work out so great.

When I did the research behind my first book, "Caponomics: Building Super Bowl Champions," which was published in 2018, I found that it took a special quarterback to win a Super Bowl with an expensive cap hit.

At the time of Kraft's conversation with Brady, the Greatest of All Time conversation at the quarterback position was a back-and-forth debate of "Is it Peyton or is it Tom?" To that point, the only quarterbacks to win Super Bowl championships on teams with a quarterback making more than 10% of the salary cap were Hall-of-Fame-level players.

Steve Young earned his first Super Bowl as a starter with the 1994 49ers at 13.1% of the cap.

Brett Favre led the 1996 Green Bay Packers at 10.2% of the cap.

Drew Bledsoe earned 10.3% of the cap on the 2001 Patriots team that Tom Brady started for.

Manning earned his first Super Bowl at 10.4% of the cap with the 2006 Indianapolis Colts, while his little brother earned his second Super Bowl in 2011 at 11.8% of the cap for the New York Giants.

A pattern I saw was great quarterbacks, who were partially considered great due to that Super Bowl success, earning championships at lower cap hits. And, when those expensive quarterbacks did win, it was often a one-off; there was no chance of a repeat.

Troy Aikman helped the Dallas Cowboys win in 1995 at 6.7% of the cap, the third Super Bowl in the Cowboys 1990s dynasty with head coach Jimmie Johnson and general manager Jerry Jones.

John Elway led the 1997 and 1998 Denver Broncos to back-to-back Super Bowl wins at 5.1% and 5.0% of the cap.



Kurt Warner was on a league-minimum contract with the 1999 St. Louis Rams.

Ben Roethlisberger was on his rookie contract when the 2005 and 2008 Pittsburgh Steelers earned their fifth and sixth Super Bowl titles.

Drew Brees led the 2009 New Orleans Saints to the franchise's first Super Bowl win at 8.7% of the cap, and just prior to the conversation Brady and Kraft had, Joe Flacco helped the 2012 Baltimore Ravens win the championship at 6.6% of the cap.

Flacco played the best ball of his career, which all led to him being paid an amount of money he would never be worth.

Aikman, Elway, and Warner are in the Hall of Fame. Big Ben and Brees will be.

Flacco won't make the Hall of Fame, but he has made almost \$175 million over his career, which is probably enough money to buy happiness and almost entirely thanks to the championship win.



In February 2013, there was little doubt that Brady and Manning were the best two quarterbacks of all time, but there was certainly doubt over who took the throne. A debate buoyed by their success, their rivalry, their vastly different draft pedigree (first for Peyton versus sixth round for Tom), their being a year apart in age, plus the fact that for six seasons, Eli Manning was the only quarterback to beat Brady in the Super Bowl before Nick Foles and the 2017 Eagles did it.

Peyton was the better quarterback statistically, but Tom had three Super Bowl championship rings to Peyton's one. And many would reply that those rings were a function of the young Tom being in the right place at the right time. Those teams had formidable defenses in Brady's first four years as a starter when he won his, at the time, three Super Bowl titles. He also had a head coach, who many were beginning to regard as the greatest coach of all time in Bill Belichick.

Meanwhile, the narrative around Manning having fewer rings, despite most believing him to be the more talented player, was that he was rarely lucky enough to have a good defense.

Tom had that magical 2007 season where the team went 18-0 before losing to Eli Manning's New York Giants in the Super Bowl, leading the league with a 68.9% completion percentage, 4806 passing yards, and 50 touchdown passes to just eight interceptions, but, at the time, Tom had two MVP trophies (2007, 2010) to Peyton's four(2003, 2004, 2008, 2009).



For good reason, the Most Valuable Player award is largely about who is the best statistical player and, quite literally, the most valuable to their team. It typically goes to the best player on one of the league's best regular season teams. Manning had more MVP trophies because he was better statistically in nearly every regular season metric.

To that point, Brady was 2-1 against Manning in the playoffs. Facing off in 2003 and 2004, the Patriots would win and go on to win the Super Bowl. The Colts would do the same in 2006. Manning would pull ahead 3-2 with wins in the AFC Championship in 2013 and 2015, with the Broncos winning the Super Bowl in 2015.

Uniquely, both had Comeback Player of the Year seasons, Tom's in 2009 following a torn ACL in Week 1 of 2008 and Peyton's in 2012, his first season with the Denver Broncos after sitting out his final season with the Colts with a neck injury.

At the time of these debates, a young Aaron Rodgers was beginning to make his case that he was in the conversation with a Super Bowl victory with the 2010 Green Bay Packers and a 2011 MVP trophy.

Back on the topic of Kraft's conversation with Brady, considering the Patriots were structurally sound, competing for championships every year already, and Brady was personally emotionally invested as well, he was


incentivized to find a way to stay in New England to build a legacy with his head coach.

To do so, Brady would have to give up millions of dollars should he agree to make room on the salary cap to help facilitate a strong roster around him.

Past addressing that, the question for the ultracompetitive Tom Brady likely became: "How am I going to cement myself as the GOAT?" First, in his battle with Peyton. Second, in his battle against all of those who would come after him.

During 2012, Manning had played at just under 15% of the salary cap with a \$18 million cap hit against a \$120.6 million salary cap, while Brady had played at 6.62% of the cap with his \$8 million cap hit. A difference of \$10 million.

A salary cap charge in the NFL is the function of accounting for a player's earnings over the life of a contract, so the cap charges his earnings for that year's cost against the team's dollars that they have to give out from an accounting basis. Cash paid is a different conversation as teams will use restructures, guarantees, and signing bonuses to manipulate the size of a player's salary cap hit so they stay under the team's overall cap limit while still facilitating the in-year payment that the player and team will both accept.

In cash terms, due to Brady converting most of his 2012 salary into a roster bonus, his cash earned was \$12 million compared to the \$8 million he accounted for on the salary cap.

In 2013, the year of the conversation with Kraft, Brady would make \$31 million in cash, but only \$13.8 million would cost against the cap. Then, in the next two years, he made just \$10 million in total cash.

There was an ebb-and-flow to his earnings, all designed to give the team the best chance at success while still respecting Brady's earning potential.

During the 2021 season, he received \$44.4 million in cash with just a \$10.5 million salary cap hit as the Buccaneers prorated out his signing bonus over the course of a new contract to allow for that lower salary cap hit through the financial mechanism that is the prorated signing bonus being extended into contract void years.

For example, a \$1 million signing bonus on a one-vear contract with four void years will have a prorated signing bonus of \$200,000 each year. Should the player complete the one-year deal and then not be re-signed, the \$800,000 in prorated signing bonus over the four void years will be accelerated into that second year as "dead money" against the team's salary cap. Dead money is money that has been spent, usually in the form of a signing bonus and needs to be accounted for with a player on the accounting side of the salary cap.

In the case of Brady and the Bucs, the consequence is the \$35.1 million "dead money" cap hit the Bucs face against the \$224.8 million salary cap in 2023. Utilizing contract void years is a new strategy teams are using to help alleviate the financial burden that is their aging, high-paid quarterback, then using his first year of retirement as a kind of wash for the franchise.

These teams go in knowing there will be a bigger financial consequence for that post retirement season, but they take on that risk to try and win one more time with that veteran signal-caller they believe in. This is a valid strategy to maximize the little bit of time left that you have with that quarterback who could take you all the way while recognizing that it's extremely unlikely you'll be able to compete at a high level the year after they're gone anyway.

In Brady's case, over the final years of his career, he was constantly open to renegotiation, taking below-market contracts, and facilitating a favorable salary cap situation for the Patriots and Buccaneers organizations. There were years with the Patriots where he would make just \$1 million in cash to help balance out the books.

In utilizing this earnings strategy, he became the player who separated himself from Manning in the GOAT conversation and distanced himself from the, at the time, up-and-coming Rodgers by facilitating the most favorable conditions to cement a legacy beyond comparison.



Over the next decade, Tom Brady would cost his two teams an average of 9.7% of the cap versus the 13.6% of the cap that Manning cost the Broncos from 2012 through 2015. That's a 3.9% difference. As an example of what that buys, 4% of the cap is about what Rob Gronkowski cost the 2014 and 2016 Patriots.,

Were Tom to have played out the rest of his career, from 2013 on, at 13.6% of the cap, he would have made \$66.7 million more than he would have been playing at the rate he played at.

If he were to have played at the 12.7% of the cap that Rodgers played at during that time, he would have made \$51.6 million more than he did.

But would he have been able to play until he was 45-years old?

And, if he did, would he have had the same narrative around his on-field success that he enjoys today?

Probably not.

After Peyton rode off into the sunset with a Super Bowl win in February 2016, during a playoff run where Peyton was a shell of himself, Brady put some serious distance between himself and Peyton in the GOAT conversation, so much so that the conversation isn't had with the same level of frequency.

After 23 seasons in the NFL, Brady retired with seven Super Bowls. His three MVP trophies, Peyton's five or Aaron's four, don't matter to the average fan anymore. His second-place appearances in MVP voting in 2013, 2015, 2016, and 2021 also cement his personal record in that regard.



Brady did eye-popping things in his later years, potentially also illustrating the capability of extending a career as a quarterback, as mental skills and knowledge continue to increase despite waning physical skills.

In his 44-year-old season, Brady led the league by throwing for 313 passing yards per game and had a league-leading 43 touchdown passes.

His post-career reputation is, of course, due to his personal performance on the football field, but it's his Super Bowl-winning legacy that has widened the gap between him and others. His seven Super Bowls are more than every franchise in the NFL.

His 10-year, \$375 million contract with FOX, which has per-year averages that are double what his contemporaries earn, is an example of the gap Brady put between himself and his contemporaries.



Former Cowboys quarterback Troy Aikman, a three-time Super Bowl-winning quarterback for America's Team, Hall of Famer, and veteran broadcaster who has been behind the microphone for about two decades, is slated to make \$92.5 million over the next five-years with ESPN. His \$18.5 million per year is \$19 million less than Brady's per year earnings, not to mention the long-term security of a 10-year contract versus a five year contract.

Joe Buck also went to ESPN for \$60 to \$75 million over five years.

Also, with ESPN, the two Manning brothers are said to make \$12 to \$18 million per year for each Manning.

For Rodgers, who earned his third and fourth MVPs in 2020 and 2021 at 37 and 38-years old, he seeks to emulate this on-field strategy for success that has also proven to be a good off-field business strategy.

The new goal is to give yourself a legacy that connects you to championships. Fans and the public at large care more about that kind of success.

To pursue that end, after being traded from Green Bay to the New York Jets, Aaron Rodgers has renegotiated his contract to alleviate his financial burden on the team in hopes that it will help end the league's longest playoff drought in 12 years.

When he came over from the Packers. Rodgers had \$110 million guaranteed left on his contract, but just before the opening of training camp this summer, he lowered his guarantee to \$75 million, giving up \$35 million that was guaranteed to him. This also signaled to veterans across the rest of the league that he's planning to be around for a while and that he is willing to do what it takes to win. Other veterans might be motivated to play for the Jets and make a little less money than they may have made elsewhere, similar to what the Patriots were able to do with Brady's example of leadership, as others wanted to play with Brady and have the best chance they could, to win a ring.

With the pay cut, Rodgers almost cut his salary cap costs in 2023 and 2024 in half while extending his contract into 2025, which was a year that was built in with an extremely low salary to prompt a re-negotiation at that time.

The 2026 season, a year in which Rodgers would be 43-years old, would be the year of the big dead money cap hit as the signing bonuses prorated into the future in the contract's void years would accelerate into that season's salary cap should Rodgers be released or retire.

That said, Rodgers is now talking like he wants to play until he is 45-years old like Brady did.

The result of the pay cut is a three-year cap average of 6.3% for Rodgers.

The other reason the chase for Super Bowl wins is the highest-order characteristic of the most dominant quarterback in the post-Brady era is that the speed with which the game is evolving is causing statistical accomplishments to be less meaningful.

Dan Marino was 10,000 passing yards ahead of John Elway when he retired with the #1 spot in all-time passing yards leaders in 1999. Now he's 8th all-time.

Manning was 14,000 yards higher than Brady when he retired, then Brady played seven more years, and he's 17,000 yards higher.

Ben Roethlisberger, Phillip Rivers, and Matt Ryan now outgain Marino on that passing yardage list. All three have been great, productive quarterbacks, but players who aren't in the same conversation as Dan Marino. Eli Manning was one more season away from passing Marino's yardage totals. Rodgers will pass them this year if he's healthy.

Marino retired with an average of 254 passing yards per game. Peyton Manning retired at 270 per game. Patrick Mahomes is averaging 303 passing yards per game.

Marino retired with a record 420 passing touchdowns. Tom Brady retired with 649, Drew Brees with 571, and Peyton Manning with 539.

The passing side of the sport has become much more efficient due to the technical advancements made by the coaches and players, plus the increased emphasis on the skill sets involved in the passing game from Pop Warner on up. Brady didn't just retire with the rings; he retired with the most yards and touchdowns, so it does have to do with personal success as well, but personal success doesn't happen without the strong team around him that helped him perform mid-way through his forties. There was this built-in expectation that a player is just supposed to keep making more money until he retires, but that would have put Brady and his teams in a more difficult position.

The game of today is different than the game of a decade ago, like it will be different from the game a decade from today. Resting on the idea that your statistical output is what will set you apart from others can't be the sole focus because someone will always come along who outperforms what you did if the game keeps going this way.


Mahomes already has two Super Bowls, including one last season with a cap hit of 17% of the cap, which sets a new record as the highest cap hit in Super Bowl champion history. A financial feat likely only he is capable of accomplishing.

While the Jets are still the Jets, just like the Mets are the Mets, two franchises that, no matter what they do, can't seem to get out of their own way, Rodgers is joining a team that returns nine of 11 starters on the NFL's fourth-best scoring defense in 2022, AP Offensive Rookie of the Year Garrett Wilson who went for 1103-receiving yards in his rookie year, and AP Defensive Rookie of the Year Sauce Gardner at cornerback.

Last year's Jets team went 7-10; they would have made the playoffs if they had a quarterback. If a team can make the playoffs, then they've got a chance to win it all.

We will see what the team does this year, and with a little bit of on-field success, the Jets may become the hottest veteran destination in the league. And if that happens, then we might see Aaron Rodgers re-insert himself in the GOAT conversation over the next couple of years.





CULTURAL DIVISION ACROSS THE RACES



I often talk about the ugly, counter-cultural society I grew up in after my father retired from the United States Air Force in 1979. Before the move to Columbus, Ohio, we were sheltered from reality in the military: "Brat Culture" that insulated us from the reality and cruelty of America at that time. Integrating into public schools was one of the hardest things I and my siblings had to face. Immediately, we knew we did not fit in, nor were we welcomed by the community we now lived in. The biggest pushback was from the blacks we met because we did not speak the language or act the way they thought we should.

Right away, I realized there was a pronounced racial division between students and self-segregation by blacks and whites. This division was apparent at the predominantly black middle school we attended. The blacks sat in the back of the bus and made the white students sit in the front of the bus. These things did not exist on military bases; racism was not tolerated as the military parents were held accountable in such cases. Because we did not fit in with either group, we did not want to go back to school ever again.

The theme continued through high school, where most of my friends were white, only because I could identify more with their culture. We also lived in a mostly white neighborhood, where we had daily interactions and closer relationships. Irony set in when many whites I did not know further confused



me by using black vernacular to talk to me. I am not sure they were helping; I felt like they were going out of their way to help me based on my skin color.

Don't think for a minute that we got a free pass from blacks because of the color of our skin. We found out very quickly we did not belong in either of the two sides of the race war we were thrown into. We were made fun of for how we dressed, walked, and talked. In my opinion, it is a crude form of discrimination not recognizing the person past the color they assume the person to be.



All of my adult life and even in recent years, I have been reminded that I am not "really black," mostly by other blacks but rarely by my white friends. What is "Black Culture?" It definitely is not skin color. It's not where you live or go to school or any other apparent factors. The derogatory term "Oreo" describes what many of us identify with. Oreo: black on the outside and white on the inside. I go into more detail in my ground-breaking book Growing up White, An Oreo's Guide to Fitting in. The fact that Oreos and cultured blacks are genetically analogous means we should strive to be united. Conversely, culture seems to be thicker than blood.

Many interracial and trans-racial adopted children experience the same discrimination and rejection the "Oreos" live with. Even black people who talk "properly" are treated as if it is a bad thing. In my book, I explain how the television series The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air was a war between the real blacks and the Oreos. The Oreo Banks were white acculturated, stiff, and boring, while the Fresh Prince and his people were real blacks to make a glaring point of how cool they were.

When we were stationed at Clark Air Base in the Philippines, my next-door neighbor



friends were interracial of both Japanese and Caucasian mix. They are referred to as "Bananas," meaning yellow on the outside and white on the inside. We are still friends to this day, and I visit them anytime I am in Georgia. They have the same issues Oreos do but with their Japanese "cultural" differences.

The Albino in the wild is rejected by the rest of the species and is shunned. Oreos feel similar when they are rejected by whichever culture they are "supposed" to belong to. One advantage Oreos have is learning the deep details of both cultures through daily interactions. If you watch black Oreo videos on YouTube, you will see that many blacks, who are not culturally appropriate, are struggling to be accepted by black communities. Many are depressed and wish they were white.

Writing my book *Growing Up White* was a necessary project for me to resolve my past issues and help others cope with the same problems I had to live with. Even though years have passed, and racial issues have eased, there are many who still grapple with race-on-race discrimination. Do we still judge people by color when we meet strangers? Are we still judged because we do not act our race appropriately? If so, we are just primitive people with technology.


DARN CONSPIRACY
